<a href="#">academy</a>	A secondary school, in the US typically a private one. <i>A police <b>academy</b>.</i>
<a href="#">campus</a>	The grounds and buildings of a university or college. <i>For the first year I had a room on <b>campus</b>.</i>
<b>coach</b>	Teach and supervise someone act as a trainer or coach to as in sports. <i>Fly or <b>coach</b> to the shores of the Mediterranean.</i>
<b>college</b>	The teaching staff and students of a college considered collectively. <i>I m at <b>college</b> studying graphic design.</i>
<b>diploma</b>	An official document or charter.
<a href="#">disciple</a>	A personal follower of Christ during his life, especially one of the twelve Apostles. <i>A <b>disciple</b> of Rousseau.</i>
<a href="#">educate</a>	Give an education to. <i>We must <b>educate</b> our youngsters better.</i>
<a href="#">educator</a>	Someone who educates young people. <i>The perspective of a professional <b>educator</b>.</i>
<b>grad</b>	A person who has received a degree from a school (high school or college or university).
<a href="#">guru</a>	Each of the ten first leaders of the Sikh religion. <i>A <b>guru</b> of genomics.</i>
<b>headmaster</b>	Presiding officer of a school.
<b>homeroom</b>	A classroom in which a group of students assembles daily with the same teacher before dispersing to other classes.
<b>matriculate</b>	A person who has matriculated. <i>He was <b>matriculated</b> at Balliol College Oxford.</i>
<b>mentor</b>	Serve as a teacher or trusted counselor. <i>The famous professor <b>mentored</b> him during his years in graduate school.</i>

<b>pedagogics</b>	The principles and methods of instruction.
<b>pedagogy</b>	The principles and methods of instruction. <i>The relationship between applied linguistics and language <b>pedagogy</b>.</i>
<b>protege</b>	A person who receives support and protection from an influential patron who furthers the protege's career.
<b>pupil</b>	A trainee barrister. <i>They are former <b>pupils</b> of the school.</i>
<b><u>school</u></b>	Educate in or as if in a school. <i>The Frankfurt <b>school</b> of critical theory.</i>
<b>schoolmaster</b>	Presiding officer of a school.
<b>semester</b>	A half-year term in a school or university, especially in North America, typically lasting for fifteen to eighteen weeks. <i>The opening week of Harvard's autumn <b>semester</b>.</i>
<b>student</b>	A learner who is enrolled in an educational institution. <i>A group of <b>student</b> nurses.</i>
<b>studying</b>	Reading carefully with intent to remember.
<b>teach</b>	A teacher. <i>She <b>teaches</b> at the local high school.</i>
<b><u>teacher</u></b>	A personified abstraction that teaches. <i>A history <b>teacher</b>.</i>
<b><u>tuition</u></b>	A fee paid for instruction (especially for higher education). <i><b>Tuition</b> and room and board were more than 25 000.</i>
<b>tutelage</b>	Instruction; tuition. <i>He felt privileged to be under the <b>tutelage</b> of an experienced actor.</i>
<b>tutorship</b>	Teaching pupils individually (usually by a tutor hired privately).
<b>undergraduate</b>	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. <i><b>Undergraduate</b> students.</i>
<b><u>university</u></b>	The body of faculty and students at a university. <i>His daughter is at <b>university</b>.</i>
