### **carbon copy**

A thin paper coated on one side with a dark waxy substance (often containing carbon); used to transfer characters from the original to an under sheet of paper.

### **clone**

A person who is almost identical to another.  
*Vines representing all the 15 existing **clones** were planted.*

<b><u>counterpart</u></b>	A person or thing that corresponds to or has the same function as another person or thing in a different place or situation. <i>The minister held talks with his French <b>counterpart</b>.</i>
<b>double</b>	A double measure of spirits. <i>You must finish the game on a <b>double</b>.</i>
<b><u>duplicate</u></b>	One of two or more identical things. <i>He made a <b>duplicate</b> for the files.</i>
<b>gemini</b>	A person who is born while the sun is in Gemini.
<b><u>image</u></b>	A standard or typical example. <i>He s the <b>image</b> of his father.</i>
<b>living image</b>	The condition of living or the state of being alive.
<b>lookalike</b>	A person or thing that closely resembles another, especially someone who looks very similar to a famous person. <i>An Elvis Presley <b>lookalike</b>.</i>
<b>mirror image</b>	A faithful depiction or reflection.
<b>non-identical twins</b>	Either of two offspring born at the same time from the same pregnancy.
<b><u>replica</u></b>	Copy that is not the original; something that has been copied. <i>It is a <b>replica</b> of an antique plaque.</i>
<b>similitude</b>	The quality or state of being similar to something. <i>Conrad uses a range of constructions which express or imply <b>similitude</b>.</i>
<b>twin falls</b>	A person who is born while the sun is in Gemini.



### **Usage Examples of "Twin" as a noun**

- *Experiments were carried out using sets of identical twins.*
- *I thought you must have a double or be a twin.*
- *The hotel has 54 rooms, of which 4 are twins.*
- *There was a bruise on his cheek, a twin to the one on mine.*

- *Give birth to twins.*
- *Link; combine.*
- *Link (a town or district) with another in a different country or cause (two towns or districts) to be linked, for the purposes of friendship and cultural exchange.*

- combine** Combine so as to form a whole mix.  
*High tides and winds **combined** to bring chaos to the east coast.*
- couple** Link or combine (something) with something else.  
*Can we **couple** these proposals.*
- duplicate** Duplicate or match.  
*The normal amount of DNA has been **uplicated** thousands of times.*
- join** Be or become joined or united or linked.  
*He **joined** the Communist Party as a young man.*
- link** Create a hyperlink between web pages or hypertext documents.  
*Rumours that **linked** his name with Judith.*

- match** Make equal uniform corresponding or matching.  
*They **matched** suitably qualified applicants with institutions that had vacancies.*
- mate** Connect or be connected mechanically.  
*The four cylinder engine is **mated** to a five speed gearbox.*
- pair** Occur in pairs.  
*Killer whales **pair** for life.*
- parallel** Make or place parallel to something.  
*They **paralleled** the ditch to the highway.*
- yoke** Link with or as with a yoke.  
*Two crackheads **yoked** this girl.*

- *The polished surface **twinned** his face and chest in reverse.*
- *The Russian city of Kostroma is **twinned** with Durham.*
- *Twin crystals.*
- *The company **twinned** its core business of brewing with that of distilling.*

### Definitions of "Twin" as an adjective

- *Forming a matching, complementary, or closely connected pair.*
- *(of a crystal) twinned.*
- *Forming, or being one of, a pair born at one birth.*
- *Being two identical.*

- double** Having two different roles or interpretations, especially in order to deceive or confuse.

<a href="#"><u>akin</u></a>	Related by blood. <i>A feeling <b>akin</b> to terror.</i>
<b>alike</b>	In a like manner. <i>The brothers were very much <b>alike</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>aunt</u></a>	The sister of one's father or mother or the wife of one's uncle. <i>She was brought up by her <b>aunt</b> and uncle.</i>
<a href="#"><u>avuncular</u></a>	Resembling a uncle in kindness or indulgence. <i>He was <b>avuncular</b> reassuring and trustworthy.</i>
<a href="#"><u>brother</u></a>	A man or boy in relation to other sons and daughters of his parents. <i>The machine is almost identical to its larger <b>brother</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>commensurate</u></a>	Corresponding in size or degree; in proportion. <i>Pay should be <b>commensurate</b> with the time worked.</i>

<b><u>comparable</u></b>	Able to be likened to another; similar. <i>The situation in Holland is <b>comparable</b> to that in England.</i>
<b>conformable</b>	Quick to comply. <i>The human adoption of practices which are <b>conformable</b> to biological constraints.</i>
<b>cousin</b>	A thing related or analogous to another. <i>Our American <b>cousins</b>.</i>
<b><u>crony</u></b>	A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities. <i>He went gambling with his cronies.</i>
<b><u>ditto</u></b>	The same thing again used in lists and accounts and often indicated by a ditto mark under the word or figure to be repeated. <i>If one folds his arms so does the other if one crosses his legs <b>ditto</b>.</i>
<b>equal</b>	Be equal to in quality or ability. <i>A society where women and men are <b>equal</b> partners.</i>
<b><u>homogeneous</u></b>	All of the same or similar kind or nature. <i>A close knit <b>homogeneous</b> group.</i>
<b><u>identical</u></b>	Having properties with uniform values along all axes. <i>The passage on the second floor was <b>identical</b> to the one below.</i>
<b>indistinguishable</b>	Exactly alike; incapable of being perceived as different. <i>They wore <b>indistinguishable</b> hats.</i>
<b>like</b>	A thing or things of the same kind (often used to express surprise or for emphasis). <i>There was this funny smell sort of dusty <b>like</b>.</i>
<b>liken</b>	Consider or describe as similar, equal, or analogous. <i>Racism is <b>likened</b> to a contagious disease.</i>
<b>likeness</b>	The semblance, guise, or outward appearance of. <i>Man created God in his own <b>likeness</b>.</i>
<b>match</b>	The score needed to win a match. <i>A dynastic <b>match</b>.</i>
<b>matching</b>	Intentionally matched. <i>A blue jacket and <b>matching</b> skirt.</i>
<b>mate</b>	South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate. <i>My best <b>mate</b> Steve.</i>
<b>niece</b>	A daughter of your brother or sister.

<b><u>pair</u></b>	The second member of a pair in relation to the first. <i>You ll now be able to <b>pair</b> your watch directly with a set of Bluetooth headphones.</i>
<b>proportionate</b>	Being in due proportion. <i><b>Proportionate</b> representation of a minority group.</i>
<b>quasi</b>	Having some resemblance. <i>A <b>quasi</b> success.</i>
<b><u>resemblance</u></b>	A way in which two or more things are alike. <i>The physical <b>resemblances</b> between humans and apes.</i>
<b><u>sibling</u></b>	A person's brother or sister.
<b>similitude</b>	A duplicate copy. <i>There is a striking <b>similitude</b> between the brother and sister.</i>
<b><u>tantamount</u></b>	Being essentially equal to something. <i>His statement was <b>tantamount</b> to an admission of guilt.</i>
<b>uncle</b>	An unrelated older male friend, especially of a child. <i>He visited his <b>uncle</b>.</i>
