A person who is almost identical to another.
*Vines representing all the 15 existing **clones** were planted.*

| double | A double measure of spirits. <i>You must finish the game on a double.</i> |
| <u>duplicate</u> | One of two or more identical things. <i>He made a duplicate for the files.</i> |
| gemini | A person who is born while the sun is in Gemini. |
| <u>image</u> | A standard or typical example. <i>He s the image of his father.</i> |
| living image | The condition of living or the state of being alive. |
| lookalike | A person or thing that closely resembles another, especially someone who looks very similar to a famous person. <i>An Elvis Presley lookalike.</i> |
| mirror image | A faithful depiction or reflection. |
| non-identical twins | Either of two offspring born at the same time from the same pregnancy. |
| <u>replica</u> | Copy that is not the original; something that has been copied. <i>It is a replica of an antique plaque.</i> |
| similitude | The quality or state of being similar to something. <i>Conrad uses a range of constructions which express or imply similitude.</i> |
| twin falls | A person who is born while the sun is in Gemini. |

- *Experiments were carried out using sets of identical twins.*
- *I thought you must have a double or be a twin.*
- *The hotel has 54 rooms, of which 4 are twins.*
- *There was a bruise on his cheek, a twin to the one on mine.*

- parallel** Make or place parallel to something.
*They **paralleled** the ditch to the highway.*
- yoke** Link with or as with a yoke.
*Two crackheads **yoked** this girl.*

- *The Russian city of Kostroma is **twinned** with Durham.*
- *Twin crystals.*
- *The company **twinned** its core business of brewing with that of distilling.*

| alike | In a like manner. <i>The brothers were very much alike.</i> |
| <u>aunt</u> | The sister of one's father or mother or the wife of one's uncle. <i>She was brought up by her aunt and uncle.</i> |
| <u>avuncular</u> | Resembling a uncle in kindness or indulgence. <i>He was avuncular reassuring and trustworthy.</i> |
| <u>brother</u> | A man or boy in relation to other sons and daughters of his parents. <i>The machine is almost identical to its larger brother.</i> |

| <u>ditto</u> | The same thing again used in lists and accounts and often indicated by a ditto mark under the word or figure to be repeated. <i>If one folds his arms so does the other if one crosses his legs ditto.</i> |
| equal | Be equal to in quality or ability. <i>A society where women and men are equal partners.</i> |
| <u>homogeneous</u> | All of the same or similar kind or nature. <i>A close knit homogeneous group.</i> |
| <u>identical</u> | Having properties with uniform values along all axes. <i>The passage on the second floor was identical to the one below.</i> |
| indistinguishable | Exactly alike; incapable of being perceived as different. <i>They wore indistinguishable hats.</i> |
| like | A thing or things of the same kind (often used to express surprise or for emphasis). <i>There was this funny smell sort of dusty like.</i> |
| liken | Consider or describe as similar, equal, or analogous. <i>Racism is likened to a contagious disease.</i> |
| likeness | The semblance, guise, or outward appearance of. <i>Man created God in his own likeness.</i> |
| match | The score needed to win a match. <i>A dynastic match.</i> |
| matching | Intentionally matched. <i>A blue jacket and matching skirt.</i> |
| mate | South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate. <i>My best mate Steve.</i> |
| niece | A daughter of your brother or sister. |

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| <u>pair</u> | The second member of a pair in relation to the first. <i>You ll now be able to pair your watch directly with a set of Bluetooth headphones.</i> |
| proportionate | Being in due proportion. <i>Proportionate representation of a minority group.</i> |
| quasi | Having some resemblance. <i>A quasi success.</i> |
| <u>resemblance</u> | A way in which two or more things are alike. <i>The physical resemblances between humans and apes.</i> |
| <u>sibling</u> | A person's brother or sister. |
| similitude | A duplicate copy. <i>There is a striking similitude between the brother and sister.</i> |
| <u>tantamount</u> | Being essentially equal to something. <i>His statement was tantamount to an admission of guilt.</i> |
| uncle | An unrelated older male friend, especially of a child. <i>He visited his uncle.</i> |
