A standard or typical example. <u>image</u> He s the **image** of his father.

living image The condition of living or the state of being alive.

A person or thing that closely resembles another, especially someone

lookalike who looks very similar to a famous person.

An Elvis Presley lookalike.

A faithful depiction or reflection. mirror image

Either of two offspring born at the same time from the same non-identical twins

pregnancy.

Copy that is not the original; something that has been copied. <u>replica</u>

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "twin" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Grow as twins.
- Bring two objects, ideas, or people together.
- Duplicate or match.
- Give birth to twins.
- Link; combine.
- Link (a town or district) with another in a different country or cause (two towns or districts) to be linked, for the purposes of friendship and cultural exchange.

- The company twinned its core business of brewing with that of distilling.






Twin as an Adjective

- (of a crystal) twinned.

- Being two identical.
