## Synonyms of "Twinkling" as a noun (8 Words)

**blink of an eye** A reflex that closes and opens the eyes rapidly.

**flash** A newsflash.  
*Flap wheels are ideal for grinding off fibreglass **flash**.*

**heartbeat** The pulsation of the heart.  
*His **heartbeat** quickened as Rose approached.*

**instant** Instant coffee.  
*Come here this **instant**.*



**jiffy**

A very short time (as the time it takes the eye to blink or the heart to beat).  
*We ll be back in a **jiffy**.*

**split second**

An opening made forcibly as by pulling apart.

**trice**

A very short time (as the time it takes the eye to blink or the heart to beat).

**wink**

An act of winking.  
*Barney gave him a knowing **wink**.*



## Associations of "Twinkling" (30 Words)

<b>approvingly</b>	In a manner resulting from or revealing approval. <i>Several heads nodded <b>approvingly</b> at this concept.</i>
<b>blink</b>	Force to go away by blinking. <i>She <b>blinked</b> away her tears.</i>
<b>blinking</b>	Used to express annoyance. <i>I'll sign off however I <b>blinking</b> well like.</i>
<b>eye</b>	The region of the face surrounding the eyes. <i>He has an artist's <b>eye</b>.</i>
<b>eyelid</b>	Either of two folds of skin that can be moved to cover or open the eye.
<b>finery</b>	Elaborate or showy attire and accessories. <i>Officers in their blue gold and scarlet <b>finery</b>.</i>
<b>flicker</b>	(of a flame) burn fitfully, alternately flaring up and dying down. <i>The <b>flicker</b> of a candle flame caught our eyes.</i>
<b>flickering</b>	Shining unsteadily. <i>The <b>flickering</b> flames cast long shadows.</i>
<b>freshen</b>	(of wind) become stronger and colder. <i>The westerly wind <b>freshened</b> and howled dismally.</i>
<b>glimmer</b>	Shine faintly with a wavering light. <i>There is one <b>glimmer</b> of hope for Becky.</i>
<b>glint</b>	A small flash of light, especially a reflected one. <i>His eyes <b>glinted</b> angrily.</i>
<b>glistening</b>	Shining with a sparkling light. <i><b>Glistening</b> bodies of swimmers.</i>
<b>grin</b>	Express with a broad smile. <i>A silly <b>grin</b>.</i>
<b>instant</b>	Instant coffee. <i>For an <b>instant</b> the moon disappeared.</i>
<b>jewel</b>	A person who is as brilliant and precious as a piece of jewelry. <i><b>Jeweled</b> dresses.</i>
<b>laugh</b>	A facial expression characteristic of a person laughing. <i>She gave a loud silly <b>laugh</b>.</i>
<b>mischievous</b>	(of an action or statement) causing or intended to cause harm or trouble. <i><b>Mischievous</b> rumors and falsehoods.</i>

<b>moment</b>	The $n$ th moment of a distribution is the expected value of the $n$ th power of the deviations from a fixed value. <i>I was waiting for the right <b>moment</b> to tell him.</i>
<u><a href="#">nod</a></u>	Signify or express greeting assent or understanding by nodding. <i>The flowers were <b>nodding</b> in the breeze.</i>
<b>polish</b>	Improve or perfect by pruning or polishing. <i><b>Polish</b> my shoes.</i>
<b>shine</b>	Make a surface shine. <i>His talent <b>shines</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">shiny</a></u>	Having a shiny surface or coating. <i><b>Shiny</b> black patents.</i>
<b>smile</b>	Express with a smile. <i>He <b>smiled</b> at Shelley.</i>
<b>smiling</b>	Smiling with happiness or optimism Lewis Carroll. <i>It s nice to see everyone s <b>smiling</b> faces.</i>
<b>spark</b>	Produce sparks at the point where an electric circuit is interrupted. <i>There was a <b>spark</b> of light.</i>
<u><a href="#">sparkle</a></u>	Shine brightly with flashes of light. <i>Unquarried marble <b>sparkled</b> on the hillside.</i>
<u><a href="#">sparkling</a></u>	Lively and witty. <i><b>Sparkling</b> water.</i>
<b>trigger</b>	Release or pull the trigger on. <i>People ask how much I weigh but I won t talk about numbers because I know that <b>triggers</b> me.</i>
<u><a href="#">twinkle</a></u>	(of a star or light, or a shiny object) shine with a gleam that changes constantly from bright to faint. <i>She looked at me with a grin and a <b>twinkle</b> in her eye.</i>
<u><a href="#">wink</a></u>	Signal by winking. <i>Barney gave him a knowing <b>wink</b>.</i>
