Twirl as a Noun

Definitions of "Twirl" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “twirl” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A sharp bend in a line produced when a line having a loop is pulled tight.*
- *An act of spinning.*
- *A spiralling or swirling shape, especially a flourish made with a pen.*
- *The act of rotating rapidly.*



Synonyms of "Twirl" as a noun (7 Words)

- kink** A person with unusual sexual tastes.
*Though the system is making some headway there are still some **kinks** to iron out.*
- pirouette** An act of spinning on one foot, typically with the raised foot touching the knee of the supporting leg.
- [spin](#) The intrinsic angular momentum of a subatomic particle.
***Spin** can be tough but it s the best cardio muscle workout.*
- turn** The act of turning away or in the opposite direction.
*Malton s comedy **turn** Mark Poole takes to the stage tonight in Cinderella.*
- [twist](#) A dance with a twisting movement of the body popular in the 1960s.
*With a quick **twist** of his head he surveyed the room.*
- twisting** The act of winding or twisting.
*It broke off after much **twisting**.*
- [whirl](#) Confused movement.
*I gave it a **whirl**.*



Usage Examples of "Twirl" as a noun

- *On the lid was a name written in old-fashioned twirls.*
- *Kate did a twirl in front of the mirror.*



Twirl as a Verb

Definitions of "Twirl" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "twirl" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Turn in a twisting or spinning motion.*
- *Cause to rotate.*

- *Spin quickly and lightly round, especially repeatedly.*
- *Cause to spin.*



Synonyms of "Twirl" as a verb (18 Words)

birl	Cause a floating log to rotate by treading. <i>My dad would have birled in his grave at the very idea.</i>
coil	Arrange something long and flexible in a coil. <i>Black smoke coiling up into the sky.</i>
curl	Play at the game of curling. <i>Her fingers curled round the microphone.</i>
gyrate	Revolve quickly and repeatedly around one's own axis. <i>Strippers gyrated to rock music on a low stage.</i>
pirouette	Perform a pirouette. <i>She pirouetted and made a bow.</i>

<u>pivot</u>	Turn on or as if on a pivot. <i>The government's reaction pivoted on the response of the Prime Minister.</i>
<u>spin</u>	Cause to spin. <i>They spin wool into the yarn for weaving.</i>
spin round	Work natural fibers into a thread.
<u>swirl</u>	Turn in a twisting or spinning motion. <i>The leaves swirled in the autumn wind.</i>
swivel	Turn around a point or axis or on a swivel. <i>She swivelled her eyes round.</i>
turn	To break and turn over earth especially with a plow. <i>Turn cartwheels.</i>
turn round	Cause (a plastic object) to assume a crooked or angular form.
twiddle	Turn or move in a twirling way. <i>She twiddled the dials on the radio.</i>
<u>twist</u>	Dance the twist. <i>She twisted her ring round and round on her finger.</i>
wheel	Push or pull a vehicle with wheels. <i>The stars wheeled through the sky.</i>
<u>whirl</u>	Flow in a circular current, of liquids. <i>Rising smoke whirled in the air.</i>
wind	Catch the scent of get wind of. <i>The road winds around the lake.</i>
<u>wrap</u>	Crash into so as to coil around. <i>When you type the text wraps to the next line.</i>



Usage Examples of "Twirl" as a verb

- *She twirled in delight to show off her new dress.*
- *She twirled her fork in the pasta.*
