<b>ignoramus</b>	An ignorant or stupid person. <i>Assume that your examiner is an <b>ignoramus</b> and explain everything to him.</i>
<b>imbecile</b>	A person of subnormal intelligence.
<b>nincompoop</b>	A foolish or stupid person.
<b><u>simpleton</u></b>	A foolish or gullible person. <i>Stop grinning at me like a <b>simpleton</b>.</i>
<b>taunt</b>	Aggravation by deriding or mocking or criticizing. <i>Pupils will play truant rather than face the <b>taunts</b> of classmates about their ragged clothes.</i>
<b>taunting</b>	Aggravation by deriding or mocking or criticizing.
<b>twerp</b>	A silly or annoying person.
<b>twirp</b>	Someone who is regarded as contemptible.

<b>rag</b>	Give a decorative effect to a painted surface by applying paint typically of a different colour with a rag. <i><b>Rag</b> ore.</i>
<b><u>rally</u></b>	Drive in a rally. <i>A series of meetings to <b>rally</b> support for the union.</i>

<b>razz</b>	Tease (someone) playfully. <i>His co workers <b>razz</b> him about it.</i>
<b>ride</b>	Ride over along or through. <i>I <b>ride</b> to work in a bus.</i>
<b>tantalise</b>	Harass with persistent criticism or carping.
<b>tantalize</b>	Excite the senses or desires of (someone). <i>She still <b>tantalized</b> him.</i>
<b>taunt</b>	Reproach (someone) with something in a contemptuous way. <i>Pupils began <b>taunting</b> her about her weight.</i>
<b>tease</b>	Raise the nap of (fabrics). <i><b>Tease</b> the roots apart and replant at once.</i>

<b>foolhardy</b>	Marked by defiant disregard for danger or consequences-Macaulay. <i>It would be <b>foolhardy</b> to go into the scheme without support.</i>
<b>foolish</b>	Devoid of good sense or judgment. <i>He was <b>foolish</b> enough to confide in her.</i>

<b>goofy</b>	A cartoon character created by Walt Disney. <i>Wore a <b>goofy</b> hat.</i>
<b>idiot</b>	A person of subnormal intelligence.
<b>idiotic</b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>I was able to hum its <b>idiotic</b> theme tune.</i>
<b>imbecile</b>	A stupid person. <i>Try not to make <b>imbecile</b> remarks.</i>
<b>inadvisable</b>	Not advisable. <i>It would be <b>inadvisable</b> to involve more than one architect.</i>
<b>inane</b>	Lacking sense or meaning; silly. <i>Don't badger people with <b>inane</b> questions.</i>
<b>oaf</b>	A man who is rough or clumsy and unintelligent. <i>They are just big clumsy <b>oafs</b>.</i>
<b>patsy</b>	A person who is easily taken advantage of, especially by being cheated or blamed for something. <i>There is a mischievous sparkle in his eyes that suggests he is no <b>patsy</b>.</i>
<b>ridiculous</b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>Her conceited assumption of universal interest in her rather dull children was <b>ridiculous</b>.</i>
<b>silly</b>	Ludicrous, foolish. <i>Come on <b>silly</b>.</i>
<b>simpleton</b>	A person lacking intelligence or common sense. <i>Stop grinning at me like a <b>simpleton</b>.</i>
<b>sucker</b>	Of a plant produce suckers. <i>He's one strong <b>sucker</b>.</i>
<b>vacuity</b>	Total lack of meaning or ideas. <i>He denounced what he considered the frivolity or <b>vacuity</b> of much contemporary painting.</i>
<b>vacuous</b>	Void of expression. <i><b>Vacuous</b> comments.</i>
<b>zany</b>	A zany person. <i>A <b>zany</b> sense of humor.</i>
