They are **fearful** of the threat of nuclear war.

Having or showing the symptoms of a fever. febrile

The **febrile** atmosphere of the city.

Feeling or displaying an excessive degree of nervous excitement,

fevered agitation, or energy.

They mopped his **fevered** brow.

Inclined to fidget; restless or uneasy. fidgety

I get nervous and **fidgety** at the dentist.

Afraid or anxious. frightened

The **frightened** child cowered in the corner.

Characterized by abrupt stops and starts or an irregular course.

He was tired and **jumpy**.

keyed up Serving as an essential component.

Equal in amount or value.

In a state of nervous excitement or anxiety. overwrought

Overwrought prose.

Worried and uneasy. restless The **restless** sea.

Fearful; frightened. scared

He s **scared** to come to you and ask for help.

Inclined to shake as from weakness or defect. <u>shaky</u>

A cracked dangerously **shaky** table.

Of a mainly liquid substance having been strained to separate

out any solid matter.

My example may seem a little **strained**.

Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture

prestressed. stressed

Stressed concrete walls.

That is on a string. strung out



tense

Pronounced with relatively tense tongue muscles e g the vowel

sound in beat.

He was tense with excitement.

Shaking or quivering, typically as a result of anxiety, excitement,

trembling or frailty.

He spoke with a **trembling** voice.

uneasy

Causing or feeling anxiety; troubled or uncomfortable.

She lived in a state of **uneasy** truce with her strict father.

worked up

Being or moving higher in position or greater in some value;

being above a former position or level.

worried Mentally upset over possible misfortune or danger etc.

One last **worried** check of the sleeping children.

wrought up

Shaped to fit by or as if by altering the contours of a pliable mass

(as by week or effort

(as by work or effort.
