Definitions of "Tying" as a noun

- *The act of tying or binding things together.*



Synonyms of "Tying" as a noun (1 Word)

ligature A character consisting of two or more joined letters, e.g. æ, fl.
*There was no sign of the **ligature** which strangled her.*



Associations of "Tying" (30 Words)

- belay** A spike of rock or other object used for belaying.
*The leader may require **belays** to tackle more difficult sections.*
- bind** Provide with a binding.
*Mix the flour with the coconut and enough egg white to **bind** them.*
- bond** Money that must be forfeited by the bondsman if an accused person fails to appear in court for trial.
*Flemish **bond**.*
- concatenate** Combine two strings to form a single one.
***Concatenate** terms.*
- concatenation** A series of interconnected things.
*It was caused by an improbable **concatenation** of circumstances.*
- entwine** Tie or link together.
*They lay **entwined** in each other's arms.*
- inextricable** Not permitting extrication; incapable of being disentangled or untied.
*An **inextricable** knot.*

interlace	Cross or be crossed intricately together; interweave. <i>Jane interlaced her fingers to form a cup.</i>
intertwine	Spin, wind, or twist together. <i>Intertwine the ribbons.</i>
knot	A length marked by knots on a log line as a measure of speed. <i>His stomach was in knots.</i>
lace	Fasten or tighten a shoe or garment by tying the laces. <i>She laced her fingers together.</i>
lariat	A rope used as a lasso or for tethering.
lasso	Catch with a lasso. <i>At last his father lassoed the horse.</i>
ligature	Bind or connect with a ligature. <i>He ligatured the duodenum below the pylorus.</i>
<u>link</u>	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>It turns out he reads my blogs and was very pleased I d linked to his article.</i>
<u>loop</u>	Fasten or join with a loop. <i>The bicycle looped around the tree.</i>
<u>loosely</u>	Knitted in a loose manner. <i>Buildings are grouped loosely around a village green.</i>
nexus	A central or focal point. <i>The nexus of any government in this country is No 10.</i>
ravel	Unravel fray. <i>A shirt with a ravelled collar.</i>
rope	Enclose or separate an area with a rope or tape. <i>Coils of rope.</i>
splice	Join by interweaving strands. <i>He had to splice the short music films together.</i>
<u>string</u>	Stretch out or arrange like a string. <i>String the package.</i>
strung	That is on a string.
<u>tangle</u>	Tangle or complicate. <i>A tangle of golden hair.</i>
<u>tie</u>	The finish of a contest in which the score is tied and the winner is undecided. <i>Swindon Town have won themselves a third round tie against Oldham.</i>

tyed

Of the score in a contest.

*The score is **tyed**.*

truss

Support a roof bridge or other structure with a truss or trusses.

*Alfred had already **trussed** and stuffed the geese.*

twine

Strong thread or string consisting of two or more strands of hemp or cotton twisted together.

***Twine** a rope.*

undergird

Lend moral support to.

*That s a philosophy that needs to **undergird** retailers business plans this year.*

unravel

(of an intricate process, system, or arrangement) disintegrate or be destroyed.

***Unravel** the thread.*
