Associations of "Typically" (30 Words)

always	Repeatedly and annoyingly. <i>He always arrives on time.</i>
anymore	At the present or from now on; usually used with a negative. <i>Alice doesn't live here anymore.</i>
barely	In a simple and sparse way. <i>Their barely furnished house.</i>
chiefly	For the most part; mostly. <i>He is remembered chiefly for his organ sonatas.</i>
commonly	Very often; frequently. <i>A commonly used industrial chemical.</i>
ever	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Why ever did you do it.</i>
exponentially	(with reference to an increase) more and more rapidly. <i>The coefficients show an exponentially decaying trend.</i>
frequently	Regularly or habitually; often. <i>They go abroad frequently.</i>
generally	In general terms; without regard to particulars or exceptions. <i>The best scheme is generally reckoned to be the Canadian one.</i>
habitually	By way of habit; customarily. <i>Does he lie habitually.</i>
hardly	Almost not. <i>I hardly think so.</i>
infrequently	Not many times. <i>He cooks but only infrequently.</i>
mainly	For the most part. <i>The west will be mainly dry.</i>

mostly	Usually; as a rule. <i>I made some good friends but mostly met closed minded people.</i>
normally	In a normal manner. <i>Try to breathe normally.</i>
occasionally	Sporadically and infrequently. <i>Very occasionally the condition can result in death.</i>
often	Frequently or in great quantities. <i>We often met over a cup of coffee.</i>
ordinarily	Usually. <i>A person who is ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom.</i>
pantehnicon	A large van for transporting furniture.
rare	Marked by an uncommon quality; especially superlative or extreme of its kind-J.R.Lowell. <i>Rare gasses.</i>
rarely	To an unusual degree; exceptionally. <i>I rarely drive above 50 mph.</i>
rareness	Noteworthy scarcity.
routinely	Frequently and without proper consideration of the consequences. <i>Large scale producers routinely vaccinate their birds against the disease.</i>
seldom	Not often. <i>An old seldom used church.</i>
sometimes	Occasionally, rather than all of the time. <i>Sometimes I want to do things on my own.</i>
sparsely	In a sparse manner. <i>A sparsely attended press conference.</i>
sporadically	Occasionally or at irregular intervals. <i>He only works sporadically.</i>
uncommonly	Exceptionally; very. <i>He is an uncommonly good talker.</i>
universally	By everyone; in every case. <i>Progress is not always universally welcomed.</i>
usually	Under normal conditions; generally. <i>He usually arrives home about one o clock.</i>
