- Dominance through threat of punishment and violence.
- A form of government in which the ruler is an absolute dictator (not restricted by a constitution or laws or opposition etc.
- (especially in ancient Greece) rule by one who has absolute power without legal right.
- Cruel and oppressive government or rule.
- Cruel, unreasonable, or arbitrary use of power or control.





Synonyms of "Tyranny" as a noun (15 Words)

absolute power

Something that is conceived or that exists independently and not in relation to other things; something that does not depend on anything else and is beyond human control; something that is not relative.

absolutism

The holding of absolute principles in political, philosophical, or theological matters.

authoritarianism

The enforcement or advocacy of strict obedience to authority at the expense of personal freedom.

autocracy

A political theory favoring unlimited authority by a single individual. *The Grand Duchy of Tuscany was an autocracy.*

caesarism

A form of government in which the ruler is an absolute dictator (not restricted by a constitution or laws or opposition etc.

despotism

A country or political system where the ruler holds absolute power. *The ideology of enlightened despotism*.



dictatorship Absolute authority in any sphere.
