Synonyms of "Unabashed" as an adjective (20 Words)

audacious	Unrestrained by convention or propriety. Audacious explorers.
barefaced	Unrestrained by convention or propriety. <i>His years of working barefaced breathing down dust.</i>
<u>blatant</u>	Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious. Blatant disregard of the law.
bold	Erotic, risqué, or sexually provocative. <i>A figure carved in bold relief.</i>
bold as brass	Fearless and daring.

<u>brazen</u>	Made of or resembling brass (as in color or hardness). <i>Brazen arrogance.</i>
confident	Not liable to error in judgment or action. <i>A confident reply.</i>
<u>fearless</u>	Invulnerable to fear or intimidation. <i>Fearless reporters and photographers.</i>
flagrant	(of an action considered wrong or immoral) conspicuously or obviously offensive. <i>Flagrant violation of human rights.</i>
immodest	Having or showing an exaggerated opinion of your importance, ability, etc. <i>TV shows full of immodest language.</i>
shameless	(of a person or their conduct) characterized by or showing a lack of shame; barefaced or brazen. <i>A shameless imposter.</i>
<u>unashamed</u>	Expressed or acting openly and without guilt or embarrassment. <i>An unashamed emotionalism.</i>
unblushing	Not feeling or showing embarrassment or shame. <i>An unblushing apologist for fascism.</i>
<u>unconcerned</u>	Lacking in interest or care or feeling. <i>Blithely unconcerned about his friend's plight.</i>
undaunted	Not intimidated or discouraged by difficulty, danger, or disappointment. <i>They were undaunted by the huge amount of work needed.</i>
undismayed	Not dismayed or discouraged by a setback. <i>Wholly undismayed by the commercial failure of the three movies he had made.</i>
unembarrassed	Not embarrassed- Jerome Stone. <i>An unembarrassed silence.</i>
unflinching	Not showing fear or hesitation in the face of danger or difficulty. <i>He has shown unflinching determination throughout the campaign.</i>
unrepentant	Stubbornly persistent in wrongdoing. <i>He was unrepentant and said that his comments were completely accurate.</i>
unshrinking	Not shrinking from danger.

Usage Examples of "Unabashed" as an adjective

- A tinsel charm and unabashed sentimentality.

- *He was unabashed by the furore his words provoked.*
