### Definitions of "Unabated" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "unabated" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Continuing at full strength or intensity.
- Without any reduction in intensity or strength.

#### Synonyms of "Unabated" as an adjective (22 Words)

constant	Occurring continuously over a period of time. The <b>constant</b> background noise of the city.
<u>continual</u>	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i>The continual banging of the shutters.</i>
continuing	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. The act provided a <b>continuing</b> annual appropriation.
continuous	Of a function or curve; extending without break or irregularity. Lived in <b>continuous</b> fear.



endless	Infinitely great in number. An <b>endless</b> conversation.
incessant	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. Night and day we live with the <b>incessant</b> noise of the city.
interminable	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. We got bogged down in <b>interminable</b> discussions.
<u>lasting</u>	Lasting a long time without change. A long <b>lasting</b> friendship.
never-ending	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.
perpetual	Never ending or changing. <i>Hell s <b>perpetual</b> fires.</i>
persistent	Continually recurring to the mind- Claudia Cassidy. <b>Persistent</b> leaves remain attached past maturity.
<u>steady</u>	Not changing; regular and established. <i>He refilled her glass with a <b>steady</b> hand.</i>
sustained	Continuous. <b>Sustained</b> flight.
unabating	Not weakening or losing intensity. The battle raged with <b>unabating</b> fury.
<u>unbroken</u>	Not plowed. Cars in an <b>unbroken</b> procession.
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.
<u>unending</u>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. The charity rescues children from <b>unending</b> poverty.
uninterrupted	Without a break in continuity. The window gives an <b>uninterrupted</b> view of the mountains.
<u>unrelenting</u>	Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty. <i>Unrelenting</i> opponents.
unrelieved	Lacking variation or change; monotonous. The burden of domestic work and childcare went largely <b>unrelieved</b> .
<u>unremitting</u>	Never relaxing or slackening; incessant. <b>Unremitting</b> demands of hunger.
<u>unstoppable</u>	Impossible to stop or prevent. As <b>unstoppable</b> as the wind.

burly	Muscular and heavily built. A big <b>burly</b> man.
charged	Having an electric charge. The highly <b>charged</b> issue of abortion.
continue	Continue in a place position or situation. We cannot <b>continue</b> several servants any longer.
continued	Without stop or interruption. The <b>continued</b> popularity of Westerns.
dauntless	Invulnerable to fear or intimidation. <i>Dauntless</i> bravery.
durability	The ability to withstand wear, pressure, or damage. The reliability and <b>durability</b> of plastics.
<u>durable</u>	Existing for a long time. A <b>durable</b> peace can be achieved.
hard	Causing great damage or hardship. The <b>hard</b> light of morning.
hardy	United States slapstick comedian who played the pompous and overbearing member of the Laurel and Hardy duo who made many films (1892-1957. <i>Hardy explorers of northern Canada.</i>
<u>heavily</u>	In a way that is mentally oppressive or hard to endure. <i>He was <b>heavily</b> influenced by the Impressionists.</i>
husky	Breed of heavy-coated Arctic sled dog. Clothing sizes for <b>husky</b> boys.
intense	Extremely sharp or intense. <i>Intense</i> itching and burning.
<u>intrepid</u>	Fearless; adventurous (often used for rhetorical or humorous effect. <i>Our <b>intrepid</b> reporter.</i>



<u>resistant</u>	Incapable of absorbing or mixing with. Some of the old Churches are <b>resistant</b> to change.
resistive	Disposed to or engaged in defiance of established authority.
<u>resolute</u>	Firm in purpose or belief; characterized by firmness and determination. <i>He was <b>resolute</b> in his fight to uphold liberal values.</i>
<u>restless</u>	Ceaselessly in motion. The <b>restless</b> wind.
robust	Strong enough to withstand or overcome intellectual challenges or adversity. <i>He took quite a <b>robust</b> view of my case.</i>
<u>stable</u>	Shelter in a stable. He is now in a <b>stable</b> condition in hospital.
<u>stalwart</u>	Dependable. A <b>stalwart</b> knight.
strong	Relating to or denoting the strongest of the known kinds of force between particles which acts between nucleons and other hadrons when closer than about 10 cm so binding protons in a nucleus despite the repulsion due to their charge and which conserves strangeness parity and isospin. <i>Gave a strong pull on the rope.</i>
<u>sturdy</u>	Substantially made or constructed. <i>Sturdy</i> canvas.
<u>tough</u>	Physically toughened. We have six <b>tough</b> matches in a row.
<u>undeterred</u>	Not deterred. He was <b>undeterred</b> by these disasters.
unflinching	Not shrinking from danger. He has shown <b>unflinching</b> determination throughout the campaign.
<u>vehement</u>	Characterized by great force or energy. A <b>vehement</b> defense.
<u>vigorous</u>	Strong and active physically or mentally- W.H.Hudson. <i>Vigorous</i> aerobic exercise.
