<b>thoroughgoing</b>	Performed comprehensively and completely. A <b>thoroughgoing</b> villain.
<u>total</u>	Constituting the full quantity or extent; complete. A <b>total</b> eclipse.
<b>unalloyed</b>	Free from admixture. <b>Unalloyed</b> pleasure.
<u>unconditional</u>	Not subject to any conditions. <b>Unconditional</b> surrender.
<b>uncontaminated</b>	Not contaminated. <b>Uncontaminated</b> air and food.
<u>unequivocal</u>	Leaving no doubt; unambiguous. An <b>unequivocal</b> answer.
<u>unmitigated</u>	Not diminished or moderated in intensity or severity; sometimes used as an intensifier. <b>Unmitigated</b> suffering.
<b>unmixed</b>	Not mixed. Not an <b>unmixed</b> blessing.
<b>unpolluted</b>	Not contaminated with noxious or poisonous substances. Her mind remains <b>unpolluted</b> by the filth they teach her.
<b>unqualified</b>	Not competent or sufficiently knowledgeable to do something. I am singularly <b>unqualified</b> to write about football.
<b>unsullied</b>	(of reputation) free from blemishes. An <b>unsullied</b> reputation.
<u>untainted</u>	Free from blemishes. The island remains virtually <b>untainted</b> by commercialism.
<u>untouched</u>	Not having come in contact. No detail is left <b>untouched</b> .
<u>utter</u>	Complete and absolute. <b>Utter</b> nonsense.
<u>veritable</u>	Not counterfeit or copied. Photographs taken in a <b>veritable</b> bull ring.

<b>innocent</b>	Without experience or knowledge of. <i>The prisoners were later found <b>innocent</b>.</i>
<b><u>intently</u></b>	With strained or eager attention. <i>Everybody was listening <b>intently</b>.</i>
<b><u>irrevocably</u></b>	In an irrevocable manner. <i>My life changed <b>irrevocably</b> in an instant.</i>

<b>knavery</b>	Lack of honesty; acts of lying or cheating or stealing.
<b>look</b>	Of a building or room have an outlook in a specified direction. <i>I don't like the <b>looks</b> of this place.</i>
<b>perfectly</b>	Used for emphasis, especially in order to assert something that has been challenged or doubted. <i>A <b>perfectly</b> idiotic idea.</i>

<u><b>spotless</b></u>	Without faults or moral blemishes; pure. <i><b>Spotless</b> behaviour is seemingly the norm in his organization.</i>
<u><b>staring</b></u>	Open and fixed as if in fear or wonder. <i><b>Staring</b> eyes.</i>
<u><b>stark</b></u>	Completely. <i><b>Stark</b> staring mad.</i>
<b>thoroughgoing</b>	Involving or attending to every detail or aspect of something. <i>A <b>thoroughgoing</b> reform of the whole economy.</i>
<u><b>totally</b></u>	Completely; absolutely. <i>They came from <b>totally</b> different backgrounds.</i>
<b>unblemished</b>	Not damaged or marked in any way. <i>An <b>unblemished</b> professional record.</i>
