bona fide	Undertaken in good faith.
<u>candid</u>	Openly straightforward and direct without reserve or secretiveness. <i>I gave them my candid opinion.</i>
<u>childlike</u>	Exhibiting childlike simplicity and credulity. Childlike trust.
earnest	Earnest. <i>Two girls were in earnest conversation.</i>
easy	Achieved without great effort; presenting few difficulties. <i>Her easy and agreeable manner.</i>
frank	Open, sincere, or undisguised. Frank enjoyment.

<u>genuine</u>	Being or reflecting the essential or genuine character of something G K Chesterton. <i>A genuine attempt to put things right.</i>
guileless	Free of deceit. <i>His face once so open and guileless.</i>
heartfelt	(of a feeling or its expression) deeply and strongly felt; sincere. <i>Our heartfelt thanks.</i>
<u>honest</u>	(of an action) done with good intentions even if unsuccessful or misguided. <i>I did the only right and honest thing.</i>
ingenuous	(of a person or action) innocent and unsuspecting. <i>An ingenuous admission of responsibility.</i>
innocent	Free from sin. <i>An innocent mistake.</i>
insensible	Without one's mental faculties, typically as a result of injury or intoxication; unconscious. <i>He lay insensible where he had fallen.</i>
<u>naive</u>	Of or created by one without formal training simple or naive in style. <i>Andy had a sweet naive look when he smiled.</i>
natural	Relating to earthly human or physical nature as distinct from the spiritual or supernatural realm. <i>Natural parent.</i>
open	Of a note sounded from an open string or pipe. <i>Students choice of degree can be kept open until the second year.</i>
plain	Lacking in physical beauty or proportion. <i>A plain fabric.</i>
profound	(of a disease or disability) very severe. <i>A case of profound liver failure.</i>
real	Coinciding with reality. <i>A real woman.</i>
simple	Of very low intelligence. <i>A simple design.</i>
<u>sincere</u>	Characterized by a firm and humorless belief in the validity of your opinions. <i>He was a good man decent and sincere.</i>
<u>spontaneous</u>	Having an open, natural, and uninhibited manner. <i>Spontaneous laughter.</i>

true	Of a compass bearing measured relative to true north. <i>True north is geographic north.</i>
unaltered	Remaining the same; unchanged. <i>Many buildings survive unaltered.</i>
<u>unassuming</u>	Not pretentious or arrogant; modest. <i>Unassuming to a fault skeptical about the value of his work.</i>
<u>unchanged</u>	Remaining in an original state. <i>The causes that produced them have remained unchanged.</i>
uncontrived	Not appearing artificial. <i>The whole effect was uncontrived.</i>
unfeigned	Genuine; sincere. <i>A broad smile of unfeigned delight.</i>
unforced	Not brought about by coercion or force. <i>His retirement was an unforced departure.</i>
uninfluenced	Not influenced or affected- V.L.Parrington. <i>Styles of dress relatively uninfluenced by popular fashion.</i>
<u>uninhibited</u>	Not having been restrained or suppressed. <i>Fits of uninhibited laughter.</i>
unmoved	Emotionally unmoved. <i>Always appeared completely unmoved and imperturbable.</i>
unpretended	Not pretended; genuine.
unpretentious	Not attempting to impress others with an appearance of greater importance, talent, or culture than is actually possessed. <i>In spite of his fame he was thoroughly unpretentious.</i>
<u>unsophisticated</u>	Lacking complexity. <i>The nightlife of Montmartre awed the unsophisticated tourists.</i>
unstilted	Flowing naturally and continuously. <i>Unstilted conversation.</i>
<u>untouched</u>	Emotionally unmoved. <i>No detail is left untouched.</i>
unworldly	Not wise in the ways of the world. <i>An almost unworldly stillness.</i>
wholehearted	With unconditional and enthusiastic devotion. <i>Gave wholehearted support to her candidacy.</i>

artless	(of persons) lacking art or knowledge. <i>An artless literary masterpiece.</i>
<u>banal</u>	So lacking in originality as to be obvious and boring. <i>Songs with banal repeated words.</i>
<u>casual</u>	A youth belonging to a subculture characterized by the wearing of expensive casual clothing and frequently associated with football hooliganism. <i>Seek help from casual passers by.</i>
<u>clarity</u>	Free from obscurity and easy to understand; the comprehensibility of clear expression. <i>It was clarity of purpose that he needed.</i>
clean	Be cleanable. <i>A clean joke.</i>
<u>clear</u>	Clear of charges or deductions. <i>A clear explanation.</i>
concatenation	The action of linking things together in a series, or the condition of being linked in such a way. <i>A concatenation of events which had finally led to the murder.</i>

concisely	In a way that is brief but comprehensive. <i>His main objections to it can be concisely summarized.</i>
conciseness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
<u>ease</u>	Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount. <i>He brought in someone new and eased them into the job.</i>
<u>facile</u>	Arrived at without due care or effort; lacking depth. <i>A man of facile and shallow intellect.</i>
<u>flawless</u>	Without a flaw. <i>Her smooth flawless skin.</i>
guileless	Devoid of guile; innocent and without deception. <i>His face once so open and guileless.</i>
<u>immaculate</u>	Free from flaws or mistakes; perfect. <i>An immaculate record.</i>
impeccable	In accordance with the highest standards; faultless. <i>Speaks impeccable French.</i>
lifelike	Evoking lifelike images within the mind. <i>A lifelike pose.</i>
limpid	(especially of writing or music) clear and accessible or melodious. <i>The limpid grey eyes gazed trustfully at her.</i>
minimalism	An avant-garde movement in music characterized by the repetition of very short phrases which change gradually, producing a hypnotic effect. <i>His living room was a testament to minimalism.</i>
<u>naive</u>	Of or created by one without formal training simple or naive in style. <i>The naive assumption that things can only get better.</i>
<u>pure</u>	Being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i>Pure and vestal modesty.</i>
<u>pushover</u>	A person who is easy to overcome or influence. <i>Colonel Moore was benevolent but no pushover.</i>
<u>readily</u>	Without hesitation or reluctance; willingly. <i>Transport is readily available.</i>
simple	Unornamented. <i>A simple game.</i>
<u>spotless</u>	Without faults or moral blemishes; pure. <i>Spotless behaviour is seemingly the norm in his organization.</i>
<u>straightforward</u>	Uncomplicated and easy to do or understand. <i>A straightforward set of instructions.</i>

uncontaminated Free from admixture with noxious elements; clean.
***Uncontaminated** air and food.*

unpolluted Not defiled or corrupted.
*Oman has 1 100 miles of splendid beaches and **unpolluted** seas.*

unsophisticated Not wise in the ways of the world- Kate O'Brien.
*Either too **unsophisticated** or too honest to promise more than he could deliver.*

unsullied Not spoiled or made impure.
*His **unsullied** name.*

well In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well.
*The visit had been planned **well** in advance.*
