<u>childlike</u>	Exhibiting childlike simplicity and credulity. <i>Childlike</i> trust.
earnest	Earnest. Two girls were in <b>earnest</b> conversation.
easy	Achieved without great effort; presenting few difficulties. <i>Her</i> <b>easy</b> and agreeable manner.
frank	Open, sincere, or undisguised. <i>Frank</i> enjoyment.



<u>genuine</u>	Being or reflecting the essential or genuine character of something G K Chesterton. A <b>genuine</b> attempt to put things right.
guileless	Free of deceit. <i>His face once so open and <b>guileless</b>.</i>
heartfelt	(of a feeling or its expression) deeply and strongly felt; sincere. <i>Our heartfelt</i> thanks.
<u>honest</u>	(of an action) done with good intentions even if unsuccessful or misguided. <i>I did the only right and <b>honest</b> thing.</i>
ingenuous	(of a person or action) innocent and unsuspecting. An <b>ingenuous</b> admission of responsibility.
innocent	Free from sin. An <b>innocent</b> mistake.
insensible	Without one's mental faculties, typically as a result of injury or intoxication; unconscious. <i>He lay insensible where he had fallen.</i>
<u>naive</u>	Of or created by one without formal training simple or naive in style. Andy had a sweet <b>naive</b> look when he smiled.
natural	Relating to earthly human or physical nature as distinct from the spiritual or supernatural realm. <i>Natural parent.</i>
open	Of a note sounded from an open string or pipe. <i>Students choice of degree can be kept <b>open</b> until the second year.</i>
plain	Lacking in physical beauty or proportion. A <b>plain</b> fabric.
profound	(of a disease or disability) very severe. A case of <b>profound</b> liver failure.
real	Coinciding with reality. A <b>real</b> woman.
simple	Of very low intelligence. A <b>simple</b> design.
<u>sincere</u>	Characterized by a firm and humorless belief in the validity of your opinions. <i>He was a good man decent and <b>sincere</b>.</i>
<u>spontaneous</u>	Having an open, natural, and uninhibited manner. <i>Spontaneous</i> laughter.



true	Of a compass bearing measured relative to true north. <i>True</i> north is geographic north.
unaltered	Remaining the same; unchanged. Many buildings survive <b>unaltered</b> .
<u>unassuming</u>	Not pretentious or arrogant; modest. <b>Unassuming</b> to a fault skeptical about the value of his work.
<u>unchanged</u>	Remaining in an original state. The causes that produced them have remained <b>unchanged</b> .
uncontrived	Not appearing artificial. The whole effect was <b>uncontrived</b> .
unfeigned	Genuine; sincere. A broad smile of <b>unfeigned</b> delight.
unforced	Not brought about by coercion or force. His retirement was an <b>unforced</b> departure.
uninfluenced	Not influenced or affected- V.L.Parrington. Styles of dress relatively <b>uninfluenced</b> by popular fashion.
<u>uninhibited</u>	Not having been restrained or suppressed. <i>Fits of <b>uninhibited</b> laughter.</i>
unmoved	Emotionally unmoved. <i>Always appeared completely</i> <b>unmoved</b> and imperturbable.
unpretended	Not pretended; genuine.
unpretentious	Not attempting to impress others with an appearance of greater importance, talent, or culture than is actually possessed. <i>In spite of his fame he was thoroughly <b>unpretentious</b>.</i>
<u>unsophisticated</u>	Lacking complexity. The nightlife of Montmartre awed the <b>unsophisticated</b> tourists.
unstilted	Flowing naturally and continuously. <i>Unstilted</i> conversation.
<u>untouched</u>	Emotionally unmoved. <i>No detail is left <b>untouched</b>.</i>
unworldly	Not wise in the ways of the world. An almost <b>unworldly</b> stillness.
wholehearted	With unconditional and enthusiastic devotion. Gave <b>wholehearted</b> support to her candidacy.

<u>casual</u>	A youth belonging to a subculture characterized by the wearing of expensive casual clothing and frequently associated with football hooliganism. Seek help from <b>casual</b> passers by.
<u>clarity</u>	Free from obscurity and easy to understand; the comprehensibility of clear expression. It was <b>clarity</b> of purpose that he needed.
clean	Be cleanable. A <b>clean</b> joke.
<u>clear</u>	Clear of charges or deductions. A <b>clear</b> explanation.

<u>ease</u>	Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount. <i>He brought in someone new and <b>ease</b>d them into the job.</i>
<u>facile</u>	Arrived at without due care or effort; lacking depth. A man of <b>facile</b> and shallow intellect.
<u>flawless</u>	Without a flaw. Her smooth <b>flawless</b> skin.
guileless	Devoid of guile; innocent and without deception. <i>His face once so open and <b>guileless</b>.</i>
<u>immaculate</u>	Free from flaws or mistakes; perfect. An <b>immaculate</b> record.
impeccable	In accordance with the highest standards; faultless. Speaks <b>impeccable</b> French.
lifelike	Evoking lifelike images within the mind. A <b>lifelike</b> pose.
limpid	(especially of writing or music) clear and accessible or melodious. The <b>limpid</b> grey eyes gazed trustfully at her.
minimalism	An avant-garde movement in music characterized by the repetition of very short phrases which change gradually, producing a hypnotic effect. <i>His living room was a testament to minimalism</i> .
<u>naive</u>	Of or created by one without formal training simple or naive in style. The <b>naive</b> assumption that things can only get better.
<u>pure</u>	Being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i>Pure</i> and vestal modesty.
<u>pushover</u>	A person who is easy to overcome or influence. Colonel Moore was benevolent but no <b>pushover</b> .
<u>readily</u>	Without hesitation or reluctance; willingly. <i>Transport is <b>readily</b> available.</i>
simple	Unornamented. A <i>simple</i> game.
<u>spotless</u>	Without faults or moral blemishes; pure. <b>Spotless</b> behaviour is seemingly the norm in his organization.
<u>straightforward</u>	Uncomplicated and easy to do or understand. A <b>straightforward</b> set of instructions.



uncontaminated	Free from admixture with noxious elements; clean. <b>Uncontaminated</b> air and food.
unpolluted	Not defiled or corrupted. Oman has 1 100 miles of splendid beaches and <b>unpolluted</b> seas.
<u>unsophisticated</u>	Not wise in the ways of the world- Kate O'Brien. Either too <b>unsophisticated</b> or too honest to promise more than he could deliver.
unsullied	Not spoiled or made impure. <i>His <b>unsullied</b> name.</i>
well	In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>The visit had been planned</i> <b>well</b> <i>in advance</i> .
