unassailableUnable to be attacked, questioned, or defeated.

An **unassailable** lead.

undebatable Not open to discussion or argument.

The **undebatable** effectiveness of learning by doing.

undeniable Unable to be denied or disputed.

It is an **undeniable** fact that some dogs are easier to train than others.

unequivocal Clearly defined or formulated- R.B. Taney.

He was **unequivocal** in condemning the violence.

univocal (of a word or term) having only one possible meaning; unambiguous.

A univocal set of instructions.

unquestionable Incapable of being questioned.

An **unquestionable** or unequivocal loss of prestige.

definite Known for certain.

I want a **definite** answer.

determinate Supplying or being a final or conclusive settlement.

A **determinate** number.

distinct Recognizably different in nature from something else of a similar type.

A distinct smell of nicotine.

evident Clearly seen or understood; obvious.

A clearly **evident** erasure in the manuscript.

of a person stating something in an explicit manner.

She made her wishes **explicit**.

(of an action considered wrong or immoral) conspicuously or obviously

flagrant offensive.

A **flagrant** violation of the law.

Having, done for, or marked by a good or legitimate reason.

The doctors were **justified** in treating her.

limpid (especially of writing or music) clear and accessible or melodious.

Writes in a **limpid** style.

Showing or having the ability to think clearly, especially in intervals

lucid between periods of confusion or insanity.

Birds dipped their wings in the **lucid** flow of air.

obvious Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent.

It was **obvious** a storm was coming in.

overt Done or shown openly; plainly apparent.

In untreated cases **overt** psychosis may occur.

palpability The quality of being perceivable by touch.

pellucid (of language) transparently clear; easily understandable.

He writes as always in **pellucid** prose.

perspicuity Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.

(of language) transparently clear; easily understandable.

A perspicuous argument.

Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly.

The advantages were **plain** to see.



positivistic Of or relating to positivism.

pronounced Strongly marked; easily noticeable.

He had a **pronounced** squint.

straightforward (of a person) honest and frank.

A **straightforward** gaze.

Vigorous or incisive in expression or style.

The White Paper makes **trenchant** criticisms of health authorities.

unequivocal Leaving no doubt; unambiguous.

An **unequivocal** promise.

univocal (of a word or term) having only one possible meaning; unambiguous.

An unequivocal or **univocal** statement.

unmistakable Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive.

His opposition to slavery was unmistakable.
