Definitions of "Unambiguous" as an adjective

- *Admitting of no doubt or misunderstanding; having only one meaning or interpretation and leading to only one conclusion.*
- *Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning.*

Synonyms of "Unambiguous" as an adjective (14 Words)

inarguable	Against which no argument can be made.
incontestable	Incapable of being contested or disputed.
incontrovertible	Not able to be denied or disputed. <i>Incontrovertible</i> proof.
indubitable	Impossible to doubt; unquestionable. An <i>indubitable</i> truth.

irrefutable	Impossible to deny or disprove. <i>An irrefutable argument.</i>
not in doubt	Directed or bound inward.
unanswerable	Impossible to answer. <i>Unanswerable questions concerning our own mortality.</i>
unarguable	Not open to disagreement; indisputable. <i>Unarguable proof of conspiracy.</i>
<u>unassailable</u>	Unable to be attacked, questioned, or defeated. <i>An unassailable lead.</i>
undebatable	Not open to discussion or argument. <i>The undebatable effectiveness of learning by doing.</i>
<u>undeniable</u>	Unable to be denied or disputed. <i>It is an undeniable fact that some dogs are easier to train than others.</i>
<u>unequivocal</u>	Clearly defined or formulated- R.B.Taney. <i>He was unequivocal in condemning the violence.</i>
univocal	(of a word or term) having only one possible meaning; unambiguous. <i>A univocal set of instructions.</i>
<u>unquestionable</u>	Incapable of being questioned. <i>An unquestionable or unequivocal loss of prestige.</i>

Usage Examples of "Unambiguous" as an adjective

- *As a horror, apartheid...is absolutely unambiguous.*
- *Instructions should be unambiguous.*

Associations of "Unambiguous" (30 Words)

<u>apparent</u>	Clearly visible or understood; obvious. <i>For all his apparent wealth he had no money to pay the rent.</i>
<u>certainly</u>	Used to indicate that a statement is made as a concession or contrasted with another. <i>She certainly is a hard worker.</i>
<u>certainty</u>	A person that is certain to do or win the specified thing. <i>His certainty reassured the others.</i>
<u>clarity</u>	The quality of transparency or purity. <i>The crystal clarity of water.</i>

clearly	Without doubt or question. <i>Could be seen clearly under the microscope.</i>
confirming	Indicating existence or presence of a suspected condition or pathogen.
decided	(of a person) having clear opinions; resolute. <i>You could never talk him round he was very decided.</i>
<u>definite</u>	Known for certain. <i>I want a definite answer.</i>
determinate	Supplying or being a final or conclusive settlement. <i>A determinate number.</i>
distinct	Recognizably different in nature from something else of a similar type. <i>A distinct smell of nicotine.</i>
<u>evident</u>	Clearly seen or understood; obvious. <i>A clearly evident erasure in the manuscript.</i>
<u>explicit</u>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>She made her wishes explicit.</i>
flagrant	(of an action considered wrong or immoral) conspicuously or obviously offensive. <i>A flagrant violation of the law.</i>
justified	Having, done for, or marked by a good or legitimate reason. <i>The doctors were justified in treating her.</i>
limpid	(especially of writing or music) clear and accessible or melodious. <i>Writes in a limpid style.</i>
<u>lucid</u>	Showing or having the ability to think clearly, especially in intervals between periods of confusion or insanity. <i>Birds dipped their wings in the lucid flow of air.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i>It was obvious a storm was coming in.</i>
<u>overt</u>	Done or shown openly; plainly apparent. <i>In untreated cases overt psychosis may occur.</i>
palpability	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
pellucid	(of language) transparently clear; easily understandable. <i>He writes as always in pellucid prose.</i>
perspicuity	Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.
perspicuous	(of language) transparently clear; easily understandable. <i>A perspicuous argument.</i>
plain	Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly. <i>The advantages were plain to see.</i>

positivistic	Of or relating to positivism.
pronounced	Strongly marked; easily noticeable. <i>He had a pronounced squint.</i>
<u>straightforward</u>	(of a person) honest and frank. <i>A straightforward gaze.</i>
<u>trenchant</u>	Vigorous or incisive in expression or style. <i>The White Paper makes trenchant criticisms of health authorities.</i>
<u>unequivocal</u>	Leaving no doubt; unambiguous. <i>An unequivocal promise.</i>
univocal	(of a word or term) having only one possible meaning; unambiguous. <i>An unequivocal or univocal statement.</i>
<u>unmistakable</u>	Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive. <i>His opposition to slavery was unmistakable.</i>
