Unambiguously as an Adverb

Definitions of "Unambiguously" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “unambiguously” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In a manner that is not open to more than one interpretation.*
- *In an unambiguous manner.*
- *So as to be unique.*

Synonyms of "Unambiguously" as an adverb (2 Words)

unequivocally In a way that leaves no doubt.
*She stated her intentions **unequivocally**.*

uniquely So as to be unique.
*A **uniquely** talented musician.*

Usage Examples of "Unambiguously" as an adverb

- *The oldest known fossil unambiguously identified as a bird.*
- *She answered questions clearly and unambiguously.*

Associations of "Unambiguously" (30 Words)

<u>apparent</u>	Seeming real or true, but not necessarily so. <i>It became apparent that he was talented.</i>
<u>certainly</u>	Used to indicate that a statement is made as a concession or contrasted with another. <i>She certainly is a hard worker.</i>
<u>certainty</u>	Something that is certain. <i>The passing of the act made a general election a certainty.</i>
<u>clarity</u>	The quality of being certain or definite. <i>For the sake of clarity each of these strategies is dealt with separately.</i>
clearly	Without doubt; obviously. <i>On white paper the seeds are clearly visible.</i>
confirming	Serving to support or corroborate.
decided	Recognizable; marked. <i>You could never talk him round he was very decided.</i>
<u>definite</u>	(of a person) certain or sure about something. <i>No definite proof has emerged.</i>
determinate	Not continuing to grow indefinitely at the apex. <i>Determinate variations in animals.</i>
distinct	Physically separate. <i>Management had interests quite distinct from those of their employees.</i>
<u>evident</u>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>A clearly evident erasure in the manuscript.</i>
<u>explicit</u>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>She made her wishes explicit.</i>
flagrant	(of an action considered wrong or immoral) conspicuously or obviously offensive. <i>A flagrant violation of the law.</i>
justified	Having words so spaced that lines have straight even margins. <i>The output is left justified.</i>
limpid	Clear and bright. <i>The limpid grey eyes gazed trustfully at her.</i>
<u>lucid</u>	Expressed clearly; easy to understand. <i>A lucid thinker.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>Unemployment has been the most obvious cost of the recession.</i>

<u>overt</u>	Open and observable; not secret or hidden. <i>An overt lie.</i>
palpability	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
pellucid	Translucently clear. <i>Mountains reflected in the pellucid waters.</i>
perspicuity	Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.
perspicuous	Able to give an account or express an idea clearly. <i>A perspicuous argument.</i>
plain	Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly. <i>Plain water.</i>
positivistic	Of or relating to positivism.
pronounced	Strongly marked; easily noticeable. <i>A pronounced flavor of cinnamon.</i>
<u>straightforward</u>	Uncomplicated and easy to do or understand. <i>A straightforward set of instructions.</i>
<u>trenchant</u>	(of a weapon or tool) having a sharp edge. <i>Trenchant distinctions between right and wrong.</i>
<u>unequivocal</u>	Clearly defined or formulated. <i>The plain and unequivocal language of the laws.</i>
univocal	(of a word or term) having only one possible meaning; unambiguous. <i>A univocal set of instructions.</i>
<u>unmistakable</u>	Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive. <i>The unmistakable sound of his laughter.</i>
