## Unambiguously as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Unambiguously" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “unambiguously” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In a manner that is not open to more than one interpretation.*
- *In an unambiguous manner.*
- *So as to be unique.*

### Synonyms of "Unambiguously" as an adverb (2 Words)

**unequivocally** In a way that leaves no doubt.  
*She stated her intentions **unequivocally**.*

**uniquely** So as to be unique.  
*A **uniquely** talented musician.*

### Usage Examples of "Unambiguously" as an adverb

- *The oldest known fossil unambiguously identified as a bird.*
- *She answered questions clearly and unambiguously.*

## Associations of "Unambiguously" (30 Words)

<b><u>apparent</u></b>	Seeming real or true, but not necessarily so. <i>It became <b>apparent</b> that he was talented.</i>
<b><u>certainly</u></b>	Used to indicate that a statement is made as a concession or contrasted with another. <i>She <b>certainly</b> is a hard worker.</i>
<b><u>certainty</u></b>	Something that is certain. <i>The passing of the act made a general election a <b>certainty</b>.</i>
<b><u>clarity</u></b>	The quality of being certain or definite. <i>For the sake of <b>clarity</b> each of these strategies is dealt with separately.</i>
<b>clearly</b>	Without doubt; obviously. <i>On white paper the seeds are <b>clearly</b> visible.</i>
<b>confirming</b>	Serving to support or corroborate.
<b>decided</b>	Recognizable; marked. <i>You could never talk him round he was very <b>decided</b>.</i>
<b><u>definite</u></b>	(of a person) certain or sure about something. <i>No <b>definite</b> proof has emerged.</i>
<b>determinate</b>	Not continuing to grow indefinitely at the apex. <i><b>Determinate</b> variations in animals.</i>
<b>distinct</b>	Physically separate. <i>Management had interests quite <b>distinct</b> from those of their employees.</i>
<b><u>evident</u></b>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>A clearly <b>evident</b> erasure in the manuscript.</i>
<b><u>explicit</u></b>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>She made her wishes <b>explicit</b>.</i>
<b>flagrant</b>	(of an action considered wrong or immoral) conspicuously or obviously offensive. <i>A <b>flagrant</b> violation of the law.</i>
<b>justified</b>	Having words so spaced that lines have straight even margins. <i>The output is left <b>justified</b>.</i>
<b>limpid</b>	Clear and bright. <i>The <b>limpid</b> grey eyes gazed trustfully at her.</i>
<b><u>lucid</u></b>	Expressed clearly; easy to understand. <i>A <b>lucid</b> thinker.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>Unemployment has been the most <b>obvious</b> cost of the recession.</i>

<b><u>overt</u></b>	Open and observable; not secret or hidden. <i>An <b>overt</b> lie.</i>
<b>palpability</b>	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
<b>pellucid</b>	Translucently clear. <i>Mountains reflected in the <b>pellucid</b> waters.</i>
<b>perspicuity</b>	Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.
<b>perspicuous</b>	Able to give an account or express an idea clearly. <i>A <b>perspicuous</b> argument.</i>
<b>plain</b>	Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly. <i><b>Plain</b> water.</i>
<b>positivistic</b>	Of or relating to positivism.
<b>pronounced</b>	Strongly marked; easily noticeable. <i>A <b>pronounced</b> flavor of cinnamon.</i>
<b><u>straightforward</u></b>	Uncomplicated and easy to do or understand. <i>A <b>straightforward</b> set of instructions.</i>
<b><u>trenchant</u></b>	(of a weapon or tool) having a sharp edge. <i><b>Trenchant</b> distinctions between right and wrong.</i>
<b><u>unequivocal</u></b>	Clearly defined or formulated. <i>The plain and <b>unequivocal</b> language of the laws.</i>
<b>univocal</b>	(of a word or term) having only one possible meaning; unambiguous. <i>A <b>univocal</b> set of instructions.</i>
<b><u>unmistakable</u></b>	Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive. <i>The <b>unmistakable</b> sound of his laughter.</i>
