Definitions of "Unambiguously" as an adverb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "unambiguously" as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- In a manner that is not open to more than one interpretation.
- In an unambiguous manner.
- So as to be unique.

Synonyms of "Unambiguously" as an adverb (2 Words)

unequivocally In a way that leaves no doubt. She stated her intentions **unequivocally**.

A uniquely talented musician.

Usage Examples of "Unambiguously" as an adverb

- The oldest known fossil unambiguously identified as a bird.
- She answered questions clearly and unambiguously.



Associations of "Unambiguously" (30 Words)

Seeming real or true, but not necessarily so. <u>apparent</u>

It became **apparent** that he was talented.

Used to indicate that a statement is made as a concession or contrasted

certainly with another.

She **certainly** is a hard worker.

Something that is certain. **certainty**

The passing of the act made a general election a **certainty**.

The quality of being certain or definite. <u>clarity</u>

For the sake of **clarity** each of these strategies is dealt with separately.

Without doubt; obviously. clearly

On white paper the seeds are **clearly** visible.

confirming Serving to support or corroborate.

Recognizable; marked. decided

You could never talk him round he was very **decided**.

(of a person) certain or sure about something. definite

No **definite** proof has emerged.

Not continuing to grow indefinitely at the apex. determinate

Determinate variations in animals.

Physically separate. distinct

Management had interests quite **distinct** from those of their employees.

Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. evident

A clearly **evident** erasure in the manuscript.

Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. **explicit**

She made her wishes explicit.

(of an action considered wrong or immoral) conspicuously or obviously

flagrant offensive.

A **flagrant** violation of the law.

Having words so spaced that lines have straight even margins. justified

The output is left **justified**.

Clear and bright. limpid

The **limpid** grey eyes gazed trustfully at her.

Expressed clearly; easy to understand.

lucid

A lucid thinker.

Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. obvious

Unemployment has been the most obvious cost of the recession.



overt Open and observable; not secret or hidden.

An **overt** lie.

palpability The quality of being perceivable by touch.

pellucid Translucently clear.

Mountains reflected in the **pellucid** waters.

perspicuity Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.

Able to give an account or express an idea clearly.

A perspicuous argument.

plainUnmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly.

Plain water.

positivistic Of or relating to positivism.

pronounced Strongly marked; easily noticeable. *A pronounced flavor of cinnamon.*

Uncomplicated and easy to do or understand.

A straightforward set of instructions.

(of a weapon or tool) having a sharp edge.

trenchantTrenchant distinctions between right and wrong.

unequivocal Clearly defined or formulated.

The plain and **unequivocal** language of the laws.

univocal (of a word or term) having only one possible meaning; unambiguous.

A univocal set of instructions.

unmistakable Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive.

The **unmistakable** sound of his laughter.
