- *(of an opinion, decision, or vote) held or carried by everyone involved.*
- *(of two or more people) fully in agreement.*
- *Acting together as a single undiversified whole.*
- *In complete agreement.*

Synonyms of "Unanimous" as an adjective (18 Words)

concerted	Done with great effort or determination. <i>You must make a concerted effort to curb this.</i>
concordant	In agreement; consistent. <i>The answers were roughly concordant.</i>
congruent	Corresponding in character or kind. <i>The rules may not be congruent with the requirements of the law.</i>

consentaneous	In complete agreement.
consentient	In complete agreement.
<u>consistent</u>	Sometimes followed by with in agreement or consistent or reliable. <i>A consistent explanation.</i>
in complete accord	Currently fashionable.
in complete agreement	Holding office.
in harmony	Directed or bound inward.
like-minded	Of the same turn of mind.
of one mind	Eminent beyond or above comparison.
of the same mind	Unchanged in character or nature.
<u>solid</u>	Of good quality and condition solidly built. <i>The rest of the acting is solid.</i>
<u>undivided</u>	Not separated into parts or shares constituting an undivided unit. <i>I can now give you my undivided attention.</i>
<u>uniform</u>	Denoting a garment forming part of a person s uniform. <i>A street of uniform tall white buildings.</i>
<u>united</u>	Of or relating to two people who are married to each other. <i>Women acting together in a united way.</i>
<u>whole</u>	Acting together as a single undiversified whole. <i>Owls usually swallow their prey whole.</i>
with one voice	Eminent beyond or above comparison.

Usage Examples of "Unanimous" as an adjective

- *A unanimous decision.*
- *The decision to go ahead was unanimous.*
- *This requires the unanimous approval of all member states.*
- *The doctors were unanimous in their diagnoses.*

Associations of "Unanimous" (30 Words)

acceptance	A draft or bill of exchange that is accepted by being signed. <i>A banker s acceptance.</i>
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accepting	Tolerating without protest. <i>Always more accepting of coaching suggestion than her teammates.</i>
accord	Give or grant someone (power, status, or recognition). <i>We are in accord with your proposal.</i>
agree	Show grammatical agreement. <i>In Australia the climate did not agree with me.</i>
agreed	Discussed or negotiated and then accepted by all parties. <i>The agreed date.</i>
agreement	Harmony of people's opinions or actions or characters. <i>There was no agreement between theory and measurement.</i>
approbation	Official approval. <i>A term of approbation.</i>
approval	The action of approving something. <i>His decision merited the approval of any sensible person.</i>
approve	Prove; show. <i>He approved himself ripe for military command.</i>
assent	To agree or express agreement. <i>The Maestro assented to the request for an encore.</i>
authorization	The power or right to give orders or make decisions. <i>The raising of revenue and the authorization of spending.</i>
bipartisan	Supported by both sides. <i>A bipartisan group.</i>
commendation	A very good result in an examination or competition. <i>The detectives received commendations for bravery.</i>
concur	Be in accord; be in agreement. <i>We strongly concur with this recommendation.</i>
concurrence	Agreement or consistency. <i>The number of possible concurrences in the diagram.</i>
consensus	Agreement in the judgment or opinion reached by a group as a whole. <i>There is a growing consensus that the current regime has failed.</i>
endorsement	The act of endorsing. <i>The entertainer made millions from Pepsi endorsements.</i>
imprimatur	A person's authoritative approval. <i>The original LP enjoyed the imprimatur of the composer.</i>
matriculation	An examination to qualify for enrolment at a college or university. <i>Matriculation requirements.</i>

ok	An endorsement. <i>Things are okay.</i>
permission	An official document giving authorization. <i>They had entered the country without permission.</i>
ratification	The action of signing or giving formal consent to a treaty, contract, or agreement, making it officially valid. <i>The ratification of the treaty.</i>
ratify	Approve and express assent, responsibility, or obligation. <i>Both countries were due to ratify the treaty by the end of the year.</i>
sanction	Give religious sanction to such as through on oath. <i>A range of sanctions aimed at deterring insider abuse.</i>
treaty	A written agreement between two states or sovereigns. <i>The two Presidents signed a ten year treaty of solidarity.</i>
unanimity	Agreement by all people involved; consensus. <i>There is almost complete unanimity on this issue.</i>
unanimously	Without opposition; with the agreement of all people involved. <i>We voted unanimously.</i>
vote	Bring into existence or make available by vote. <i>Incompetent judges are voted out of office.</i>
voting	A choice that is made by counting the number of people in favor of each alternative.
yes	An affirmative answer or decision, especially in voting. <i>Answering with assured and ardent yesses.</i>
