### Definitions of "Unanimous" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “unanimous” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of an opinion, decision, or vote) held or carried by everyone involved.*
- *(of two or more people) fully in agreement.*
- *Acting together as a single undiversified whole.*
- *In complete agreement.*

### Synonyms of "Unanimous" as an adjective (18 Words)

<b>concerted</b>	Done with great effort or determination. <i>You must make a <b>concerted</b> effort to curb this.</i>
<b>concordant</b>	In agreement; consistent. <i>The answers were roughly <b>concordant</b>.</i>
<b><u>congruent</u></b>	Corresponding in character or kind. <i>The rules may not be <b>congruent</b> with the requirements of the law.</i>

<b>consentaneous</b>	In complete agreement.
<b>consentient</b>	In complete agreement.
<b><u>consistent</u></b>	Sometimes followed by with in agreement or consistent or reliable. <i>A <b>consistent</b> explanation.</i>
<b>in complete accord</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>in complete agreement</b>	Holding office.
<b>in harmony</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>like-minded</b>	Of the same turn of mind.
<b>of one mind</b>	Eminent beyond or above comparison.
<b>of the same mind</b>	Unchanged in character or nature.
<b><u>solid</u></b>	Of good quality and condition solidly built. <i>The rest of the acting is <b>solid</b>.</i>
<b><u>undivided</u></b>	Not separated into parts or shares constituting an undivided unit. <i>I can now give you my <b>undivided</b> attention.</i>
<b><u>uniform</u></b>	Denoting a garment forming part of a person s uniform. <i>A street of <b>uniform</b> tall white buildings.</i>
<b><u>united</u></b>	Of or relating to two people who are married to each other. <i>Women acting together in a <b>united</b> way.</i>
<b><u>whole</u></b>	Acting together as a single undiversified whole. <i>Owls usually swallow their prey <b>whole</b>.</i>
<b>with one voice</b>	Eminent beyond or above comparison.

## Usage Examples of "Unanimous" as an adjective

- *A unanimous decision.*
- *The decision to go ahead was unanimous.*
- *This requires the unanimous approval of all member states.*
- *The doctors were unanimous in their diagnoses.*

<b>acceptance</b>	A draft or bill of exchange that is accepted by being signed. <i>A banker s <b>acceptance</b>.</i>

<b>accepting</b>	Tolerating without protest. <i>Always more <b>accepting</b> of coaching suggestion than her teammates.</i>
<b>accord</b>	Give or grant someone (power, status, or recognition). <i>We are in <b>accord</b> with your proposal.</i>
<b>agree</b>	Show grammatical agreement. <i>In Australia the climate did not <b>agree</b> with me.</i>
<b>agreed</b>	Discussed or negotiated and then accepted by all parties. <i>The <b>agreed</b> date.</i>
<b>agreement</b>	Harmony of people's opinions or actions or characters. <i>There was no <b>agreement</b> between theory and measurement.</i>
<b>approbation</b>	Official approval. <i>A term of <b>approbation</b>.</i>
<b>approval</b>	The action of approving something. <i>His decision merited the <b>approval</b> of any sensible person.</i>
<b>approve</b>	Prove; show. <i>He <b>approved</b> himself ripe for military command.</i>
<b>assent</b>	To agree or express agreement. <i>The Maestro <b>assented</b> to the request for an encore.</i>
<b>authorization</b>	The power or right to give orders or make decisions. <i>The raising of revenue and the <b>authorization</b> of spending.</i>
<b>bipartisan</b>	Supported by both sides. <i>A <b>bipartisan</b> group.</i>
<b>commendation</b>	A very good result in an examination or competition. <i>The detectives received <b>commendations</b> for bravery.</i>
<b>concur</b>	Be in accord; be in agreement. <i>We strongly <b>concur</b> with this recommendation.</i>
<b>concurrence</b>	Agreement or consistency. <i>The number of possible <b>concurrences</b> in the diagram.</i>
<b>consensus</b>	Agreement in the judgment or opinion reached by a group as a whole. <i>There is a growing <b>consensus</b> that the current regime has failed.</i>
<b>endorsement</b>	The act of endorsing. <i>The entertainer made millions from Pepsi <b>endorsements</b>.</i>
<b>imprimatur</b>	A person's authoritative approval. <i>The original LP enjoyed the <b>imprimatur</b> of the composer.</i>
<b>matriculation</b>	An examination to qualify for enrolment at a college or university. <i><b>Matriculation</b> requirements.</i>

<b>ok</b>	An endorsement. <i>Things are <b>okay</b>.</i>
<b>permission</b>	An official document giving authorization. <i>They had entered the country without <b>permission</b>.</i>
<b>ratification</b>	The action of signing or giving formal consent to a treaty, contract, or agreement, making it officially valid. <i>The <b>ratification</b> of the treaty.</i>
<b>ratify</b>	Approve and express assent, responsibility, or obligation. <i>Both countries were due to <b>ratify</b> the treaty by the end of the year.</i>
<b>sanction</b>	Give religious sanction to such as through on oath. <i>A range of <b>sanctions</b> aimed at deterring insider abuse.</i>
<b>treaty</b>	A written agreement between two states or sovereigns. <i>The two Presidents signed a ten year <b>treaty</b> of solidarity.</i>
<b>unanimity</b>	Agreement by all people involved; consensus. <i>There is almost complete <b>unanimity</b> on this issue.</i>
<b>unanimously</b>	Without opposition; with the agreement of all people involved. <i>We voted <b>unanimously</b>.</i>
<b>vote</b>	Bring into existence or make available by vote. <i>Incompetent judges are <b>voted</b> out of office.</i>
<b>voting</b>	A choice that is made by counting the number of people in favor of each alternative.
<b>yes</b>	An affirmative answer or decision, especially in voting. <i>Answering with assured and ardent <b>yeses</b>.</i>
