- *Not answered or responded to.*
- *Not returned in kind.*

Synonyms of "Unanswered" as an adjective (14 Words)

disputed	Subject to disagreement and debate.
doubtful	Feeling uncertain about something. <i>It is doubtful whether these schemes have any lasting effect.</i>
in doubt	Holding office.
open	Of a victor having won an open competition. <i>Open ballots.</i>
open to debate	Full of small openings or gaps.
open to question	Not brought to a conclusion; subject to further thought.
pending	Awaiting decision or settlement. <i>Business still pending.</i>

<u>undecided</u>	Characterized by indecision. <i>Too many voters still declare they are undecided.</i>
undetermined	Not precisely determined or established; not fixed or known in advance. <i>The bus was travelling with an undetermined number of passengers when it crashed.</i>
unreciprocated	Not returned in kind. <i>His feelings for her were unreciprocated.</i>
<u>unrequited</u>	Not returned in kind. <i>He s been pining with unrequited love.</i>
unresolved	Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved. <i>A number of issues remain unresolved.</i>
unsettled	Subject to change. <i>An unsettled issue.</i>
up in the air	Operating properly.
