### **Definitions of "Unappreciative" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “unappreciative” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Not feeling or expressing gratitude.*
- *Not fully understanding, recognizing, or valuing something.*
- *Having value that is not acknowledged.*
- *Not likely to be rewarded.*



### Synonyms of "Unappreciative" as an adjective (3 Words)

- thankless** Not likely to be rewarded.  
*How sharper than a serpent's tooth it is To have a **thankless** child.*
- ungracious** Not graceful or elegant.  
*After Anna's kindness I wouldn't want to seem **ungracious**.*
- unthankful** Not feeling or showing gratitude- Shakespeare.  
*No company ever went from them **unthankful**.*

### Usage Examples of "Unappreciative" as an adjective

- *They were unappreciative of country problems.*
- *Unappreciative of nature's bounty.*

## Associations of "Unappreciative" (30 Words)

<b>abstruse</b>	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>An <b>abstruse</b> philosophical inquiry.</i>
<b>blur</b>	Make unclear indistinct or blurred. <i>His novels <b>blur</b> the boundaries between criticism and fiction.</i>
<b>classified</b>	(of newspaper or magazine advertisements) organized in categories according to what is being advertised. <i>Thousands of <b>classified</b> documents have now been <b>declassified</b>.</i>
<b>concealed</b>	Not accessible to view. <i><b>Concealed</b> or hidden damage.</i>
<b>elusive</b>	Difficult to describe. <i>A cabal of conspirators each more <b>elusive</b> than the archterrorist.</i>
<b>esoteric</b>	Confined to and understandable by only an enlightened inner circle. <i>A compilation of <b>esoteric</b> philosophical theories.</i>
<b>hidden</b>	Difficult to find. <i>A <b>hidden</b> room or place of concealment such as a priest hole.</i>
<b>inconspicuous</b>	Not prominent or readily noticeable. <i>He pushed the string through an <b>inconspicuous</b> hole.</i>
<b>indefinite</b>	Lasting for an unknown or unstated length of time. <i>Plans are <b>indefinite</b>.</i>
<b>indistinct</b>	Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. <i>His speech was slurred and <b>indistinct</b>.</i>
<b>inglorious</b>	(of an action or situation) causing shame or a loss of honour. <i><b>Inglorious</b> defeat.</i>
<b>invisible</b>	Invisible exports and imports. <i>Before 1971 women artists were pretty well <b>invisible</b>.</i>
<b>lonely</b>	Marked by dejection from being alone. <i><b>Lonely</b> old people whose families do not care for them.</i>
<b>lonesome</b>	Being the only one; single and isolated from others. <i>A <b>lonesome</b> unfriendly place.</i>
<b>nameless</b>	Deliberately not identified; anonymous. <i>The myths talk about <b>nameless</b> horrors infesting our universe.</i>
<b>obscure</b>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>None of this should <b>obscure</b> the skill and perseverance of the workers.</i>

<b><u>privacy</u></b>	The quality of being secluded from the presence or view of others. <i>She returned to the <b>privacy</b> of her own home.</i>
<b>recondite</b>	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>Some <b>recondite</b> problem in historiography.</i>
<b>secret</b>	Of information given in confidence or in secret. <i><b>Secret</b> messages.</i>
<b><u>shameful</u></b>	Deserving or bringing disgrace or shame- Rachel Carson. <i>A <b>shameful</b> display of cowardice.</i>
<b><u>stealthy</u></b>	Marked by quiet and caution and secrecy; taking pains to avoid being observed. <i><b>Stealthy</b> footsteps.</i>
<b><u>subtlety</u></b>	A subtle difference in meaning or opinion or attitude. <i>The textural <b>subtlety</b> of Degas.</i>
<b><u>trivia</u></b>	Something of small importance. <i>We fill our days with meaningless <b>trivia</b>.</i>
<b><u>undiscovered</u></b>	Not yet discovered. <i>The novel had lain <b>undiscovered</b> for years among his papers.</i>
<b>unidentified</b>	Not recognized or identified. <i>An <b>unidentified</b> witness.</i>
<b>unknown</b>	An unknown and unexplored region. <i>Exploration into <b>unknown</b> territory.</i>
<b><u>unnamed</u></b>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>An <b>unnamed</b> donor.</i>
<b><u>unnoticeable</u></b>	Not noticeable; not drawing attention- J.G.Cozzens. <i>An <b>unnoticeable</b> cigarette burn on the carpet.</i>
<b>unrewarding</b>	Not rewarding or satisfying. <i>It was dull <b>unrewarding</b> work.</i>
<b>unsung</b>	Not famous or acclaimed. <i>Harvey is one of the <b>unsung</b> heroes of the industrial revolution.</i>
