- *Having value that is not acknowledged.*
- *Not likely to be rewarded.*

- thankless** Not likely to be rewarded.
*How sharper than a serpent's tooth it is To have a **thankless** child.*
- ungracious** Not graceful or elegant.
*After Anna's kindness I wouldn't want to seem **ungracious**.*
- unthankful** Not feeling or showing gratitude- Shakespeare.
*No company ever went from them **unthankful**.*

Usage Examples of "Unappreciative" as an adjective

- *They were unappreciative of country problems.*
- *Unappreciative of nature's bounty.*

Associations of "Unappreciative" (30 Words)

abstruse	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>An abstruse philosophical inquiry.</i>
blur	Make unclear indistinct or blurred. <i>His novels blur the boundaries between criticism and fiction.</i>
classified	(of newspaper or magazine advertisements) organized in categories according to what is being advertised. <i>Thousands of classified documents have now been declassified.</i>
concealed	Not accessible to view. <i>Concealed or hidden damage.</i>
elusive	Difficult to describe. <i>A cabal of conspirators each more elusive than the archterrorist.</i>
esoteric	Confined to and understandable by only an enlightened inner circle. <i>A compilation of esoteric philosophical theories.</i>
hidden	Difficult to find. <i>A hidden room or place of concealment such as a priest hole.</i>
inconspicuous	Not prominent or readily noticeable. <i>He pushed the string through an inconspicuous hole.</i>
indefinite	Lasting for an unknown or unstated length of time. <i>Plans are indefinite.</i>
indistinct	Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. <i>His speech was slurred and indistinct.</i>
inglorious	(of an action or situation) causing shame or a loss of honour. <i>Inglorious defeat.</i>
invisible	Invisible exports and imports. <i>Before 1971 women artists were pretty well invisible.</i>
lonely	Marked by dejection from being alone. <i>Lonely old people whose families do not care for them.</i>
lonesome	Being the only one; single and isolated from others. <i>A lonesome unfriendly place.</i>
nameless	Deliberately not identified; anonymous. <i>The myths talk about nameless horrors infesting our universe.</i>
obscure	Make obscure or unclear. <i>None of this should obscure the skill and perseverance of the workers.</i>

<u>privacy</u>	The quality of being secluded from the presence or view of others. <i>She returned to the privacy of her own home.</i>
recondite	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>Some recondite problem in historiography.</i>
secret	Of information given in confidence or in secret. <i>Secret messages.</i>
<u>shameful</u>	Deserving or bringing disgrace or shame- Rachel Carson. <i>A shameful display of cowardice.</i>
<u>stealthy</u>	Marked by quiet and caution and secrecy; taking pains to avoid being observed. <i>Stealthy footsteps.</i>
<u>subtlety</u>	A subtle difference in meaning or opinion or attitude. <i>The textural subtlety of Degas.</i>
<u>trivia</u>	Something of small importance. <i>We fill our days with meaningless trivia.</i>
<u>undiscovered</u>	Not yet discovered. <i>The novel had lain undiscovered for years among his papers.</i>
unidentified	Not recognized or identified. <i>An unidentified witness.</i>
unknown	An unknown and unexplored region. <i>Exploration into unknown territory.</i>
<u>unnamed</u>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>An unnamed donor.</i>
<u>unnoticeable</u>	Not noticeable; not drawing attention- J.G.Cozzens. <i>An unnoticeable cigarette burn on the carpet.</i>
unrewarding	Not rewarding or satisfying. <i>It was dull unrewarding work.</i>
unsung	Not famous or acclaimed. <i>Harvey is one of the unsung heroes of the industrial revolution.</i>
