- Having value that is not acknowledged.
- Not likely to be rewarded.

thankless Not likely to be rewarded.

How sharper than a serpent s tooth it is To have a **thankless** child.

ungracious Not graceful or elegant.

After Anna s kindness I wouldn t want to seem **ungracious**.

unthankful Not feeling or showing gratitude- Shakespeare.
No company ever went from them unthankful.

Usage Examples of "Unappreciative" as an adjective

- They were unappreciative of country problems.
- Unappreciative of nature's bounty.



Associations of "Unappreciative" (30 Words)

Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding

abstruse or knowledge.

An **abstruse** philosophical inquiry.

Make unclear indistinct or blurred.

His novels **blur** the boundaries between criticism and fiction.

(of newspaper or magazine advertisements) organized in categories

classified according to what is being advertised.

Thousands of **classified** documents have now been de**classified**.

concealed Not accessible to view.

Concealed or hidden damage.

elusive Difficult to describe.

A cabal of conspirators each more **elusive** than the archterrorist.

esoteric Confined to and understandable by only an enlightened inner circle.

A compilation of **esoteric** philosophical theories.

hidden Difficult to find.

A **hidden** room or place of concealment such as a priest hole.

inconspicuous Not prominent or readily noticeable.

He pushed the string through an **inconspicuous** hole.

indefinite Lasting for an unknown or unstated length of time.

Plans are **indefinite**.

indistinct Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand.

His speech was slurred and indistinct.

inglorious (of an action or situation) causing shame or a loss of honour.

Inglorious defeat.

invisible Invisible exports and imports.

Before 1971 women artists were pretty well **invisible**.

lonely Marked by dejection from being alone.

Lonely old people whose families do not care for them.

Being the only one; single and isolated from others.

lonesome

A lonesome unfriendly place.

nameless Deliberately not identified; anonymous.

The myths talk about **nameless** horrors infesting our universe.

obscure Make obscure or unclear.

None of this should **obscure** the skill and perseverance of the workers.



The quality of being secluded from the presence or view of others.

She returned to the **privacy** *of her own home.*

Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding

recondite or knowledge.

Some **recondite** problem in historiography.

Of information given in confidence or in secret.

secret Secret messages.

shameful Deserving or bringing disgrace or shame- Rachel Carson.

A **shameful** display of cowardice.

Marked by quiet and caution and secrecy; taking pains to avoid being

stealthy observed.

Stealthy footsteps.

A subtle difference in meaning or opinion or attitude.

The textural **subtlety** of Degas.

trivia Something of small importance.

We fill our days with meaningless **trivia**.

undiscovered Not yet discovered.

The novel had lain **undiscovered** for years among his papers.

unidentified Not recognized or identified.

An unidentified witness.

unknown An unknown and unexplored region.

Exploration into **unknown** territory.

unnamed Being or having an unknown or unnamed source.

An **unnamed** donor.

unnoticeable Not noticeable; not drawing attention- J.G.Cozzens.

An **unnoticeable** cigarette burn on the carpet.

unrewarding Not rewarding or satisfying.

ng It was dull **unrewarding** work.

Not famous or acclaimed.
