| irrefutable | Impossible to deny or disprove. <i>An irrefutable argument.</i> |
| <u>manifest</u> | Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>Manifest disapproval.</i> |
| obvious | Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>Obvious errors.</i> |
| <u>patent</u> | Made and marketed under a patent proprietary. <i>Patent milk powder.</i> |
| positive | Having a positive charge. <i>Adopt a positive outlook on life.</i> |
| <u>proven</u> | Demonstrated by evidence or argument to be true or existing. <i>A proven risk to health.</i> |
| <u>secure</u> | Free from danger or risk. <i>A secure unit for young offenders.</i> |
