conclusive	(of evidence or argument) having or likely to have the effect of proving a case; decisive. <i>The findings were by no means conclusive.</i>
impenetrable	(of matter) incapable of occupying the same space as other matter at the same time. <i>Her expression was impenetrable.</i>
impregnable	(of a fortified position) unable to be captured or broken into. <i>An impregnable fortress.</i>
incontestable	Incapable of being contested or disputed.
incontrovertible	Impossible to deny or disprove. <i>Incontrovertible proof of the defendant's innocence.</i>
indisputable	Not open to question; obviously true. <i>Indisputable evidence of a witness.</i>
indubitable	Too obvious to be doubted. <i>An indubitable truth.</i>
<u>invincible</u>	Too powerful to be defeated or overcome. <i>An invincible army.</i>
inviolable	Immune to attack; incapable of being tampered with. <i>The Polish German border was inviolable.</i>
invulnerable	Impossible to harm or damage. <i>Gunners raked the beach from invulnerable positions on the cliffs.</i>
irrefutable	Impossible to deny or disprove. <i>An irrefutable argument.</i>
<u>manifest</u>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>Manifest disapproval.</i>
obvious	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>Obvious errors.</i>
<u>patent</u>	Made and marketed under a patent proprietary. <i>Patent milk powder.</i>
positive	Having a positive charge. <i>Adopt a positive outlook on life.</i>
<u>proven</u>	Demonstrated by evidence or argument to be true or existing. <i>A proven risk to health.</i>
<u>secure</u>	Free from danger or risk. <i>A secure unit for young offenders.</i>
sound	In good condition; free from defect or damage or decay. <i>A sound timber.</i>

strong	Strong and sure. <i>They had established a strong and trusting relationship.</i>
sure	Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured. <i>I m sure I ve seen that dress before.</i>
unattackable	Immune to attack; incapable of being tampered with.
unconquerable	(especially of a place, people, or emotion) not conquerable. <i>An unconquerable pride.</i>
undeniable	Not possible to deny. <i>It is an undeniable fact that some dogs are easier to train than others.</i>
unquestionable	Not able to be disputed or doubted. <i>His musicianship is unquestionable.</i>
unshakable	Without flaws or loopholes.
untouchable	Forbidden to the touch. <i>In most museums such articles are untouchable.</i>
watertight	Closely sealed, fastened, or fitted so that no water enters or passes through. <i>A watertight compartment.</i>

convinced	Completely certain about something. <i>A convinced pacifist.</i>

foolproof	Incapable of going wrong or being misused. <i>Foolproof this appliance.</i>
impregnable	Incapable of being overcome, challenged or refuted. <i>A massive and impregnable fortress.</i>
<u>inalienable</u>	Incapable of being repudiated or transferred to another. <i>The shareholders have the inalienable right to dismiss directors.</i>
incontestable	Not open to question; obviously true.
incontrovertible	Necessarily or demonstrably true. <i>Incontrovertible proof.</i>
indefeasible	Not liable to being annulled or voided or undone. <i>An indefeasible claim to the title.</i>
indisputable	Not open to question; obviously true. <i>Indisputable evidence of a witness.</i>
infrangible	Unbreakable; inviolable. <i>An infrangible series.</i>
<u>invincible</u>	Too powerful to be defeated or overcome. <i>An invincible army.</i>
inviolable	Never to be broken, infringed, or dishonoured. <i>The Polish German border was inviolable.</i>
inviolable	Must be kept sacred. <i>An international memorial which must remain inviolable.</i>
invulnerable	Impossible to harm or damage. <i>No state in the region is now invulnerable to attack by another.</i>
irrefutable	Impossible to deny or disprove. <i>An irrefutable argument.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>Unemployment has been the most obvious cost of the recession.</i>
<u>sacrosanct</u>	Must be kept sacred. <i>The individual's right to work has been upheld as sacrosanct.</i>
<u>secure</u>	Not likely to fail or give way. <i>A secure telephone connection.</i>
<u>sure</u>	Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured. <i>Sure he'll come.</i>
