# **Unattractive as an Adjective**

### Definitions of "Unattractive" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "unattractive" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Lacking power to arouse interest.
- Not appealing to the senses.
- Having no inviting or beneficial features.
- Not pleasing or appealing to look at.
- Lacking beauty or charm.

### Synonyms of "Unattractive" as an adjective (11 Words)

<u>disagreeable</u>	Unpleasant to interact with. A <b>disagreeable</b> old man.
displeasing	Causing displeasure or lacking pleasing qualities. It was not entirely <b>displeasing</b> to be the centre of such a drama.
hideous	Extremely unpleasant. A <b>hideous</b> pattern of injustice.
ill-favoured	Usually used of a face.



plain	Denoting or relating to a type of knitting stitch produced by putting the needle through the front of each stitch from left to right. <i>Donations can be put in a <b>plain</b> envelope.</i>
unappealing	(of characters in literature or drama) tending to evoke antipathetic feelings. Was forced to talk to his singularly <b>unappealing</b> hostess.
unlovely	Without beauty or charm. <b>Unlovely</b> tower blocks.
unprepossessing	Creating an unfavorable or neutral first impression. Despite his <b>unprepossessing</b> appearance he had an animal magnetism.
unsightly	Unpleasant to look at; ugly. An <b>unsightly</b> rubbish tip.
untempting	Not tempting. <b>Untempting</b> food.

### Usage Examples of "Unattractive" as an adjective

- *He was an extremely unattractive man with no sex appeal.*
- An unattractive deep red brick.
- As unattractive as most mining regions.
- She believed she was unattractive and overweight.
- The silence was broken by a strange and unattractive sound.
- *If the revised bid is unattractive, it may not be accepted.*
- Being unemployed is a most unattractive prospect.

## Associations of "Unattractive" (30 Words)

<u>atrocious</u>	Of a very poor quality; extremely bad or unpleasant. <i>He attempted an <b>atrocious</b> imitation of my English accent.</i>
<u>banal</u>	So lacking in originality as to be obvious and boring. Songs with <b>banal</b> repeated words.
banality	A trite or obvious remark. There is an essential <b>banality</b> to the story he tells.
boring	The act of drilling a hole in the earth in the hope of producing petroleum. A <b>boring</b> evening with uninteresting people.
dull	Make dull or blunt. When cutting hard rock the edge soon became <b>dull</b> .



ennui	A feeling of listlessness and dissatisfaction arising from a lack of occupation or excitement. <i>He succumbed to ennui and despair.</i>
<u>exterior</u>	The outer side or surface of something. <i>Exterior</i> locations.
eyesore	A thing that is very ugly, especially a building. The office crumbled into an <b>eyesore</b> .
featureless	Lacking distinctive attributes or aspects. A <b>featureless</b> landscape of snow and ice.
homely	Without artificial refinement or elegance. <i>Homely</i> truths.
humdrum	Monotonous routine. An escape from the <b>humdrum</b> of his life.
indecorous	Lacking propriety and good taste in manners and conduct. A pub crawl with sundry <b>indecorous</b> adventures.
irksome	Irritating; annoying. Petty regulations were becoming very <b>irksome</b> .
<u>lackluster</u>	Lacking luster or shine. Staring with <b>lackluster</b> eyes.
<u>monotonous</u>	Sounded or spoken in a tone unvarying in pitch. <i>The owl s faint <b>monotonous</b> hooting.</i>
<u>monotony</u>	Constancy of tone or pitch or inflection. <i>He had never grown accustomed to the <b>monotony</b> of his work.</i>
plain	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. I m finished with you I ll tell you <b>plain</b> .
prosaic	Commonplace; unromantic. A <b>prosaic</b> and unimaginative essay.
<u>tedious</u>	Too long, slow, or dull; tiresome or monotonous. A <b>tedious</b> journey.
<u>trite</u>	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. This point may now seem obvious and <b>trite</b> .
<u>unbecoming</u>	(of behaviour) not fitting or appropriate; unseemly. It was <b>unbecoming</b> for a university to do anything so crass as advertising its wares.
undistinguished	Not worthy of notice. An <b>undistinguished</b> career.



unlovely	Without beauty or charm. <b>Unlovely</b> tower blocks.
unprepossessing	Not attractive or appealing to the eye. Despite his <b>unprepossessing</b> appearance he had an animal magnetism.
<u>unremarkable</u>	Not particularly interesting or surprising. His early childhood was <b>unremarkable</b> .
unseemly	Not in keeping with accepted standards of what is right or proper in polite society. An <b>unseemly</b> squabble.
unsightly	Unpleasant to look at; ugly. <b>Unsightly</b> billboards.
unvaried	Not involving change. A plain <b>unvaried</b> diet.
wearisome	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. They insisted on his presence at <b>wearisome</b> musical soir es.
