<b><u>blind</u></b>	Not controlled by reason. <i>Fresco paintings on the <b>blind</b> windows.</i>
<b>deaf</b>	Unwilling or refusing to pay heed. <i><b>Deaf</b> children.</i>
<b>heedless</b>	Marked by or paying little heed or attention–Franklin D. Roosevelt. <i>His <b>heedless</b> impetuosity.</i>
<b>ignorant</b>	Discourteous or rude. <i>I was largely <b>ignorant</b> of the effects of radiotherapy.</i>

<b>inattentive</b>	Not showing due care or attention. <i><b>Inattentive</b> students.</i>
<b>incognizant</b>	Lacking knowledge or awareness. <i>The government appears <b>incognizant</b> of the growing threat to our agricultural industry.</i>
<b>innocent</b>	Without; lacking. <i>An <b>innocent</b> mistake.</i>
<b>insensible</b>	(of a person or bodily extremity) without feeling; numb. <i><b>Insensible</b> to pain.</i>
<b><u>insensitive</u></b>	Showing or feeling no concern for others' feelings. <i>An <b>insensitive</b> remark.</i>
<b><u>oblivious</u></b>	Lacking conscious awareness of. <i>She became absorbed <b>oblivious</b> to the passage of time.</i>
<b><u>unconscious</u></b>	Not awake and aware of and responding to one's environment. <i>What is it he said again <b>unconscious</b> of the repetition.</i>
<b>unenlightened</b>	Lacking information or instruction. <i><b>Unenlightened</b> thinking.</i>
<b><u>uninformed</u></b>	Not having or showing awareness or understanding of the facts. <i><b>Uninformed</b> criticism of conservation projects.</i>
<b><u>unknowing</u></b>	Unaware because of a lack of relevant information or knowledge. <i>The lions moved stealthily towards their <b>unknowing</b> victims.</i>
<b>unmindful</b>	(followed by `to' or `of') lacking conscious awareness of. <i>Not <b>unmindful</b> of the heavy responsibility.</i>
<b>unobservant</b>	Not consciously observing. <i>She can be pretty <b>unobservant</b>.</i>
<b>unperceptive</b>	Lacking sensitivity, taste, or judgment. <i>As <b>unperceptive</b> as a boulder.</i>
<b><u>unresponsive</u></b>	Aloof or indifferent. <i>Was <b>unresponsive</b> to her passionate advances.</i>
<b>unsuspecting</b>	(of a person or animal) not aware of the presence of danger; feeling no suspicion. <i>An <b>unsuspecting</b> victim.</i>
<b>unwitting</b>	Not aware or knowing. <i>We are anxious to rectify the <b>unwitting</b> mistakes made in the past.</i>

<b>absentminded</b>	Lost in thought; showing preoccupation. <i>An <b>absentminded</b> professor.</i>
<b>accidentally</b>	Without advance planning. <i><b>Accidentally</b> knocked the vase over.</i>
<b>blind</b>	Make blind by putting the eyes out. <i>A <b>blind</b> man with a stick.</i>
<b>casually</b>	In a relaxed and informal way. <i>She was just <b>casually</b> strolling through the mall.</i>
<b>cognizance</b>	Having knowledge of. <i>The Renaissance <b>cognizance</b> of Greece was limited.</i>
<b>distract</b>	Having the attention diverted especially because of anxiety. <i>He seemed oddly <b>distract</b>.</i>
<b>forgetful</b>	Failing to keep in mind. <i>I m a bit <b>forgetful</b> these days.</i>
<b>ignoramus</b>	An ignorant person. <i>Assume that your examiner is an <b>ignoramus</b> and explain everything to him.</i>
<b>ignorant</b>	Unaware because of a lack of relevant information or knowledge. <i>He was completely <b>ignorant</b> of the circumstances.</i>
<b>illiterate</b>	Uneducated in the fundamentals of a given art or branch of learning; lacking knowledge of a specific field. <i>His parents were <b>illiterate</b>.</i>
<b>insensible</b>	(of a person or bodily extremity) without feeling; numb. <i><b>Insensible</b> to pain.</i>
<b>intentionally</b>	Deliberately; on purpose. <i>I wasn t sure if it was <b>intentionally</b> funny or not.</i>

<b><u>oblivious</u></b>	Not aware of or concerned about what is happening around one. <i>She became absorbed <b>oblivious</b> to the passage of time.</i>
<b>shiftless</b>	Characterized by laziness, indolence, and a lack of ambition. <i>A <b>shiftless</b> lot of good for nothings.</i>
<b><u>simpleton</u></b>	A person lacking intelligence or common sense. <i>Stop grinning at me like a <b>simpleton</b>.</i>
<b><u>subconscious</u></b>	The subconscious part of the mind not in technical use in psychoanalysis where unconscious is preferred. <i>Uncertainties were lurking around the edge of her <b>subconscious</b>.</i>
<b><u>unconscious</u></b>	Not knowing or perceiving- Charles Dickens. <i>The boy was beaten <b>unconscious</b>.</i>
<b>unconsciously</b>	Without awareness. <i>Ben smiled <b>unconsciously</b> when he heard her voice.</i>
<b>uneducated</b>	Having or showing a poor level of education. <i>Women from <b>uneducated</b> backgrounds.</i>
<b><u>unexpected</u></b>	Not expected or regarded as likely to happen. <i>He seemed to have a knack for saying the <b>unexpected</b>.</i>
<b><u>unintended</u></b>	Not planned or meant. <i>The <b>unintended</b> consequences of people's actions.</i>
<b><u>unintentional</u></b>	Without deliberate intent- George Macdonald. <i>An <b>unintentional</b> pun.</i>
<b><u>unintentionally</u></b>	Not on purpose. <i>I may have <b>unintentionally</b> misled some of you.</i>
<b>unknown</b>	An unknown and unexplored region. <i>Things obscurely felt surged up from <b>unknown</b> depths.</i>
<b>unlettered</b>	(of a person) poorly educated or illiterate. <i>Exhibiting contempt for his <b>unlettered</b> companions.</i>
<b>unmindful</b>	(followed by 'to' or 'of') lacking conscious awareness of. <i>Not <b>unmindful</b> of the heavy responsibility.</i>
<b>untutored</b>	Not formally taught or trained. <i>The species are all much the same to the <b>untutored</b> eye.</i>
<b><u>unwillingly</u></b>	Against one's wishes; reluctantly. <i>He <b>unwillingly</b> went back to the family business in the City.</i>
<b>unwitting</b>	(of a person) not aware of the full facts. <i>His rudeness was <b>unwitting</b>.</i>
