Synonyms of "Unaware" as an adjective (20 Words)

<u>blind</u>	Not controlled by reason. <i>Fresco paintings on the blind windows.</i>
deaf	Unwilling or refusing to pay heed. <i>Deaf children.</i>
heedless	Marked by or paying little heed or attention–Franklin D. Roosevelt. <i>His heedless impetuosity.</i>
ignorant	Discourteous or rude. <i>I was largely ignorant of the effects of radiotherapy.</i>

inattentive	Not showing due care or attention. <i>Inattentive students.</i>
incognizant	Lacking knowledge or awareness. <i>The government appears incognizant of the growing threat to our agricultural industry.</i>
innocent	Without; lacking. <i>An innocent mistake.</i>
insensible	(of a person or bodily extremity) without feeling; numb. <i>Insensible to pain.</i>
<u>insensitive</u>	Showing or feeling no concern for others' feelings. <i>An insensitive remark.</i>
<u>oblivious</u>	Lacking conscious awareness of. <i>She became absorbed oblivious to the passage of time.</i>
<u>unconscious</u>	Not awake and aware of and responding to one's environment. <i>What is it he said again unconscious of the repetition.</i>
unenlightened	Lacking information or instruction. <i>Unenlightened thinking.</i>
<u>uninformed</u>	Not having or showing awareness or understanding of the facts. <i>Uninformed criticism of conservation projects.</i>
<u>unknowing</u>	Unaware because of a lack of relevant information or knowledge. <i>The lions moved stealthily towards their unknowing victims.</i>
unmindful	(followed by `to' or `of') lacking conscious awareness of. <i>Not unmindful of the heavy responsibility.</i>
unobservant	Not consciously observing. <i>She can be pretty unobservant.</i>
unperceptive	Lacking sensitivity, taste, or judgment. <i>As unperceptive as a boulder.</i>
<u>unresponsive</u>	Aloof or indifferent. <i>Was unresponsive to her passionate advances.</i>
unsuspecting	(of a person or animal) not aware of the presence of danger; feeling no suspicion. <i>An unsuspecting victim.</i>
unwitting	Not aware or knowing. <i>We are anxious to rectify the unwitting mistakes made in the past.</i>

Usage Examples of "Unaware" as an adjective

- *Unaware of the danger they were in.*
- *Seemed unaware of the scrutiny.*
- *The most unaware person I've known.*
- *Unaware of the newborn hope.*

accidentally	Without advance planning. <i>Accidentally knocked the vase over.</i>
blind	Make blind by putting the eyes out. <i>A blind man with a stick.</i>
casually	In a relaxed and informal way. <i>She was just casually strolling through the mall.</i>
cognizance	Having knowledge of. <i>The Renaissance cognizance of Greece was limited.</i>
distract	Having the attention diverted especially because of anxiety. <i>He seemed oddly distract.</i>
forgetful	Failing to keep in mind. <i>I m a bit forgetful these days.</i>
ignoramus	An ignorant person. <i>Assume that your examiner is an ignoramus and explain everything to him.</i>
ignorant	Unaware because of a lack of relevant information or knowledge. <i>He was completely ignorant of the circumstances.</i>
illiterate	Uneducated in the fundamentals of a given art or branch of learning; lacking knowledge of a specific field. <i>His parents were illiterate.</i>
insensible	(of a person or bodily extremity) without feeling; numb. <i>Insensible to pain.</i>
intentionally	Deliberately; on purpose. <i>I wasn t sure if it was intentionally funny or not.</i>

<u>oblivious</u>	Not aware of or concerned about what is happening around one. <i>She became absorbed oblivious to the passage of time.</i>
shiftless	Characterized by laziness, indolence, and a lack of ambition. <i>A shiftless lot of good for nothings.</i>
<u>simpleton</u>	A person lacking intelligence or common sense. <i>Stop grinning at me like a simpleton.</i>
<u>subconscious</u>	The subconscious part of the mind not in technical use in psychoanalysis where unconscious is preferred. <i>Uncertainties were lurking around the edge of her subconscious.</i>
<u>unconscious</u>	Not knowing or perceiving- Charles Dickens. <i>The boy was beaten unconscious.</i>
unconsciously	Without awareness. <i>Ben smiled unconsciously when he heard her voice.</i>
uneducated	Having or showing a poor level of education. <i>Women from uneducated backgrounds.</i>
<u>unexpected</u>	Not expected or regarded as likely to happen. <i>He seemed to have a knack for saying the unexpected.</i>
<u>unintended</u>	Not planned or meant. <i>The unintended consequences of people's actions.</i>
<u>unintentional</u>	Without deliberate intent- George Macdonald. <i>An unintentional pun.</i>
<u>unintentionally</u>	Not on purpose. <i>I may have unintentionally misled some of you.</i>
unknown	An unknown and unexplored region. <i>Things obscurely felt surged up from unknown depths.</i>
unlettered	(of a person) poorly educated or illiterate. <i>Exhibiting contempt for his unlettered companions.</i>
unmindful	(followed by 'to' or 'of') lacking conscious awareness of. <i>Not unmindful of the heavy responsibility.</i>
untutored	Not formally taught or trained. <i>The species are all much the same to the untutored eye.</i>
<u>unwillingly</u>	Against one's wishes; reluctantly. <i>He unwillingly went back to the family business in the City.</i>
unwitting	(of a person) not aware of the full facts. <i>His rudeness was unwitting.</i>
