overpowering Extremely strong or intense; overwhelming.

office.

unacceptable Not acceptable; not welcome.

Unacceptable behaviour.

unendurable Not able to be tolerated or endured.

Cries of unendurable suffering.

unmanageable Difficult or impossible to manage, manipulate, or control.

His behaviour was becoming **unmanageable** at home.

unsupportable Not able to be supported or defended.

Usage Examples of "Unbearable" as an adjective

• The heat was getting unbearable.

Associations of "Unbearable" (30 Words)

abstinent A person who refrains from drinking intoxicating beverages.

Not totally abstinent but abstemious.

banned Forbidden by law.

crazy (of an angle) appearing absurdly out of place or unlikely.

A football **crazy** bunch of boys.

discontented Showing or experiencing dissatisfaction or restless longing.

Was discontented with his position.

discouraged

Made less hopeful or enthusiastic.

The accident left others **discouraged** about going there.

disgruntled In a state of sulky dissatisfaction.

Judges receive letters from **disgruntled** members of the public.

dissatisfied In a state of sulky dissatisfaction.

Dissatisfied customers.

Denoting or involving a transition between two quantum-mechanical states

that does not conform to some selection rule, especially for electric dipole

forbidden radiation.

A list of forbidden books.



impermissible Not permitted.

Their refusal to discuss the issue is **impermissible**.

impossible (used of persons or their behavior) not acceptable or reasonable.

An **impossible** situation.

inadequate Lacking the quality or quantity required; insufficient for a purpose.

The staff was **inadequate**.

inadmissible Not deserving to be admitted.

He held that such evidence was **inadmissible**.

insufferable Too extreme to bear.

Insufferable insolence.

intolerable Incapable of being tolerated or endured.

The **intolerable** pressures of his work.

objectionable Causing disapproval or protest.

A vulgar and **objectionable** person.

outrageous Wildly exaggerated or improbable.

The **outrageous** claims made by the previous government.

<u>pessimistic</u>

Expecting the worst possible outcome.

He was possimistic about the prespects

He was **pessimistic** about the prospects.

prohibit Formally forbid someone from doing something.

The budget agreement had **prohibit**ed any tax cuts.

The period from 1920 to 1933 when the sale of alcoholic beverages was

prohibition prohibited in the United States by a constitutional amendment.

They were restrained by a **prohibition** in their charter.

prohibitionist A reformer who opposes the use of intoxicating beverages.

prohibitory Tending to discourage (especially of prices.

ridiculously

So as to arouse or deserve laughter.

Ridiculously I felt like crying.

Place under a taboo.

The burial ground was seen as a **taboo** place.

unacceptable Used of persons or their behavior.

The coach told his players that defeat was **unacceptable**.

unendurable Incapable of being put up with. *Cries of unendurable suffering.*

ches of **unendurable** suffering.

unimaginable Difficult or impossible to imagine or comprehend.

Lives of almost **unimaginable** deprivation.

Difficult to put up with or accept.

unpalatable Unpalatable truths.



Not pleasing in odor or taste. *An unsavory scandal.* unsavory

unsupportable Not able to be supported or defended.

Incapable of being conceived or considered. The **unthinkable** happened I spoke up. $\underline{unthinkable}$
