- So great or extreme as to be difficult to believe; extraordinary.

amazing	Inspiring awe or admiration or wonder. An <b>amazing</b> number of people registered.
<u>astonishing</u>	Surprising greatly. I find it <b>astonishing</b> that they ever thought it could work
<u>astounding</u>	Surprisingly impressive or notable. An <b>astounding</b> achievement.
difficult to believe	Hard to control.
exceptional	Surpassing what is common or usual or expected. <i>A child of <b>exceptional</b> ability.</i>
extraordinary	Very unusual or remarkable. An <b>extraordinary</b> session of the legislature.
improbable	Too improbable to admit of belief. <i>The characters have <b>improbable</b> names.</i>



<u>inconceivable</u>	Totally unlikely. It seemed <b>inconceivable</b> that the president had been unaware of what was going on.
incredible	Impossible to believe. I was mesmerized she looked so <b>incredible</b> .
marvellous	Extremely good or pleasing; splendid. These <b>marvellous</b> technological toys are fun to play with.
<u>miraculous</u>	Being or having the character of a miracle. I felt amazed and grateful for our <b>miraculous</b> escape.
<u>phenomenal</u>	Of or relating to a phenomenon. <b>Phenomenal</b> feats of memory.
prodigious	Unnatural or abnormal. The stove consumed a <b>prodigious</b> amount of fuel.
<u>sensational</u>	Very good indeed; very impressive or attractive. Cheap <b>sensational</b> periodicals.
stunning	Extremely impressive or attractive. A <b>stunning</b> detonation with volumes of black smoke.
<u>unconvincing</u>	Not convincing. She felt the lie was <b>unconvincing</b> .
unimaginable	Totally unlikely. Lives of almost <b>unimaginable</b> deprivation.
unlikely	Has little chance of being the case or coming about. <i>Prices are <b>unlikely</b> to change.</i>
<u>unthinkable</u>	(of a situation or event) too unlikely or undesirable to be considered a possibility. The <b>unthinkable</b> happened I spoke up.
wonderful	Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers. The climate was <b>wonderful</b> all the year round.

doubtful	Not known with certainty. It was <b>doubtful</b> whether she would be admitted.
fabulous	Extremely pleasing. The <b>fabulous</b> unicorn.
farfetched	(of a theory or explanation) highly imaginative but unlikely and unconvincing. A <b>farfetched</b> excuse.
implausible	(of an argument or statement) not seeming reasonable or probable; failing to convince. <i>Gave the teacher an <b>implausible</b> excuse.</i>
<u>impossible</u>	Used of persons or their behavior. What an arrogant <b>impossible</b> fool.
improbable	Too improbable to admit of belief. The characters have <b>improbable</b> names.
<u>inconceivable</u>	Not capable of being imagined or grasped mentally; unbelievable. <i>They behaved with <b>inconceivable</b> cruelty.</i>
incredible	Impossible to believe. The book s plot is simply <b>incredible</b> .
<u>marvelous</u>	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. A <b>marvelous</b> collection of rare books.
<u>miraculous</u>	Being or having the character of a miracle. I felt amazed and grateful for our <b>miraculous</b> escape.
miraculously	In a way that suggests or resembles a miracle. The two drivers <b>miraculously</b> escaped with only minor injuries.
profound	Profound quality. A <b>profound</b> philosopher.
redoubtable	Inspiring fear- G.H.Johnston. The <b>redoubtable</b> ladies.
<u>staggering</u>	Deeply shocking; astonishing. Suffered a <b>staggering</b> defeat.
<u>supposed</u>	Based primarily on surmise rather than adequate evidence. The <b>supposed</b> existence of ghosts.
unbelief	Lack of religious belief; an absence of faith. <i>The darkness of <b>unbelief</b>.</i>
<u>unconvincing</u>	Failing to make someone believe that something is true or valid. <i>She felt the lie was <b>unconvincing</b></i> .



<u>unfaithful</u>	Not trustworthy. Her <b>unfaithful</b> husband.
unimaginable	Totally unlikely. Lives of almost <b>unimaginable</b> deprivation.
<u>unlikely</u>	Has little chance of being the case or coming about. An <b>unlikely</b> candidate for reelection.
unreliable	Not able to be relied upon. <i>He s lazy and <b>unreliable</b></i> .
<u>unthinkable</u>	Incapable of being conceived or considered. It was <b>unthinkable</b> that John could be dead.
untrustworthy	Not worthy of trust or belief. Thomas considered her to be devious and <b>untrustworthy</b> .
wonderful	Inspiring delight, pleasure, or admiration; extremely good; marvellous. <i>The climate was <b>wonderful</b> all the year round</i> .
