**stunning** Extremely impressive or attractive.

A **stunning** detonation with volumes of black smoke.

unconvincing Not convincing.

She felt the lie was **unconvincing**.

unimaginable Totally unlikely.

Lives of almost **unimaginable** deprivation.

unlikely

Has little chance of being the case or coming about.

Prices are **unlikely** to change.

(of a situation or event) too unlikely or undesirable to be considered a

**unthinkable** possibility.

The **unthinkable** happened I spoke up.

wonderful Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers.

The climate was wonderful all the year round.

Thomas considered her to be devious and untrustworthy.

wonderful Inspiring delight, pleasure, or admiration; extremely good; marvellous.

The climate was **wonderful** all the year round.
