- *So great or extreme as to be difficult to believe; extraordinary.*

amazing	Inspiring awe or admiration or wonder. <i>An amazing number of people registered.</i>
<u>astonishing</u>	Surprising greatly. <i>I find it astonishing that they ever thought it could work.</i>
<u>astounding</u>	Surprisingly impressive or notable. <i>An astounding achievement.</i>
difficult to believe	Hard to control.
exceptional	Surpassing what is common or usual or expected. <i>A child of exceptional ability.</i>
extraordinary	Very unusual or remarkable. <i>An extraordinary session of the legislature.</i>
improbable	Too improbable to admit of belief. <i>The characters have improbable names.</i>

<u>inconceivable</u>	Totally unlikely. <i>It seemed inconceivable that the president had been unaware of what was going on.</i>
incredible	Impossible to believe. <i>I was mesmerized she looked so incredible.</i>
marvellous	Extremely good or pleasing; splendid. <i>These marvellous technological toys are fun to play with.</i>
<u>miraculous</u>	Being or having the character of a miracle. <i>I felt amazed and grateful for our miraculous escape.</i>
<u>phenomenal</u>	Of or relating to a phenomenon. <i>Phenomenal feats of memory.</i>
prodigious	Unnatural or abnormal. <i>The stove consumed a prodigious amount of fuel.</i>
<u>sensational</u>	Very good indeed; very impressive or attractive. <i>Cheap sensational periodicals.</i>
stunning	Extremely impressive or attractive. <i>A stunning detonation with volumes of black smoke.</i>
<u>unconvincing</u>	Not convincing. <i>She felt the lie was unconvincing.</i>
unimaginable	Totally unlikely. <i>Lives of almost unimaginable deprivation.</i>
<u>unlikely</u>	Has little chance of being the case or coming about. <i>Prices are unlikely to change.</i>
<u>unthinkable</u>	(of a situation or event) too unlikely or undesirable to be considered a possibility. <i>The unthinkable happened I spoke up.</i>
wonderful	Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers. <i>The climate was wonderful all the year round.</i>

- *Unbelievable or not, it happened.*

<u>amaze</u>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>He has been amazed by the quality of the employees at the bank.</i>
astonish	Surprise or impress (someone) greatly. <i>It astonished her that he was so anxious.</i>
<u>astonishing</u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>I find it astonishing that they ever thought it could work.</i>
astound	Shock or greatly surprise. <i>Her bluntness astounded him.</i>
<u>astounding</u>	Surprisingly impressive or notable. <i>The summit offers astounding views.</i>
<u>disbelief</u>	Lack of faith. <i>I ll burn in hell for disbelief.</i>

doubtful	Not known with certainty. <i>It was doubtful whether she would be admitted.</i>
fabulous	Extremely pleasing. <i>The fabulous unicorn.</i>
farfetched	(of a theory or explanation) highly imaginative but unlikely and unconvincing. <i>A farfetched excuse.</i>
implausible	(of an argument or statement) not seeming reasonable or probable; failing to convince. <i>Gave the teacher an implausible excuse.</i>
<u>impossible</u>	Used of persons or their behavior. <i>What an arrogant impossible fool.</i>
improbable	Too improbable to admit of belief. <i>The characters have improbable names.</i>
<u>inconceivable</u>	Not capable of being imagined or grasped mentally; unbelievable. <i>They behaved with inconceivable cruelty.</i>
incredible	Impossible to believe. <i>The book's plot is simply incredible.</i>
<u>marvelous</u>	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>A marvelous collection of rare books.</i>
<u>miraculous</u>	Being or having the character of a miracle. <i>I felt amazed and grateful for our miraculous escape.</i>
miraculously	In a way that suggests or resembles a miracle. <i>The two drivers miraculously escaped with only minor injuries.</i>
profound	Profound quality. <i>A profound philosopher.</i>
redoubtable	Inspiring fear- G.H. Johnston. <i>The redoubtable ladies.</i>
<u>staggering</u>	Deeply shocking; astonishing. <i>Suffered a staggering defeat.</i>
<u>supposed</u>	Based primarily on surmise rather than adequate evidence. <i>The supposed existence of ghosts.</i>
unbelief	Lack of religious belief; an absence of faith. <i>The darkness of unbelief.</i>
<u>unconvincing</u>	Failing to make someone believe that something is true or valid. <i>She felt the lie was unconvincing.</i>

- unimaginable** Totally unlikely.
*Lives of almost **unimaginable** deprivation.*
- unlikely** Has little chance of being the case or coming about.
*An **unlikely** candidate for reelection.*
- unreliable** Not able to be relied upon.
*He s lazy and **unreliable**.*
- unthinkable** Incapable of being conceived or considered.
*It was **unthinkable** that John could be dead.*
- untrustworthy** Not worthy of trust or belief.
*Thomas considered her to be devious and **untrustworthy**.*
- wonderful** Inspiring delight, pleasure, or admiration; extremely good; marvellous.
*The climate was **wonderful** all the year round.*
