<b>unchecked</b>	Not restrained or controlled. <i>Prices rose <b>unchecked</b> hitting the poor worst of all.</i>

<b>uncontrolled</b>	Not being under control; out of control. <i><b>Uncontrolled</b> growth.</i>

<b>uncurbed</b>	Not restrained or kept in check. <i>Their activities continue to be largely <b>uncurbed</b>.</i>
<b>ungoverned</b>	Lacking in discipline or control. <i><b>Ungoverned</b> youth.</i>
<b>uninhibited</b>	Not inhibited or restrained. <i>Fits of <b>uninhibited</b> laughter.</i>
<b>unquenchable</b>	Impossible to quench. <i><b>Unquenchable</b> thirst.</i>
<b>unrestrained</b>	Marked by uncontrolled excitement or emotion. <i>A display of <b>unrestrained</b> delight.</i>
<b>unrestricted</b>	Never having had security classification. <i><b>Unrestricted</b> access to both military bases.</i>
<b>unstoppable</b>	Not capable of being stopped. <i>As <b>unstoppable</b> as the wind.</i>

<b><u>immeasurable</u></b>	Beyond calculation or measure. <i><b>Immeasurable</b> suffering.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
<b>inestimable</b>	Beyond calculation or measure. <i>Jewels of <b>inestimable</b> value.</i>
<b>inexhaustible</b>	(of an amount or supply of something) unable to be used up because existing in abundance. <i>His <b>inexhaustible</b> energy.</i>
<b><u>infinite</u></b>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>Intimations of the <b>infinite</b>.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>We got bogged down in <b>interminable</b> discussions.</i>
<b><u>limitless</u></b>	Without limits in extent or size or quantity. <i><b>Limitless</b> vastness of our solar system.</i>
<b>measureless</b>	Without limits in extent or size or quantity. <i>Otto had <b>measureless</b> charm.</i>
<b>overweening</b>	Unrestrained, especially with regard to feelings. <i>Had a witty but <b>overweening</b> manner.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>The <b>perpetual</b> struggle to maintain standards in a democracy.</i>
<b>renewable</b>	Capable of being renewed; replaceable. <i>Production costs for the <b>renewables</b> are higher than for coal oil or gas.</i>
<b><u>spontaneous</u></b>	Happening or arising without apparent external cause. <i>The audience broke into <b>spontaneous</b> applause.</i>
<b><u>unbounded</u></b>	Having or appearing to have no limits. <i><b>Unbounded</b> enthusiasm.</i>
<b><u>unchecked</u></b>	Not restrained or controlled. <i>Prices rose <b>unchecked</b> hitting the poor worst of all.</i>
<b>unfettered</b>	Unrestrained or uninhibited. <i><b>Unfettered</b> artistic genius.</i>
<b><u>uninhibited</u></b>	Expressing one's feelings or thoughts unselfconsciously and without restraint. <i>Fits of <b>uninhibited</b> laughter.</i>

<b>unlimited</b>	That cannot be entirely consumed or used up. <i>To start with a theory of <b>unlimited</b> freedom is to end up with <b>unlimited</b> despotism.</i>
<b>unobstructed</b>	Free from impediment or obstruction or hindrance. <i>An <b>unobstructed</b> view of the traffic lights.</i>
<u><b>unorganized</b></u>	Not organized. <i><b>Unorganized</b> data.</i>
<b>unreserved</b>	Not set apart for a particular purpose or booked in advance. <i>A tall <b>unreserved</b> young man.</i>
<u><b>unrestrained</b></u>	Not subject to restraint. <i>A display of <b>unrestrained</b> delight.</i>
<b>unrestricted</b>	Not restricted or modified in meaning. <i>I had <b>unrestricted</b> access.</i>
