uncurbed	Not restrained or kept in check. <i>Their activities continue to be largely uncurbed.</i>
ungoverned	Lacking in discipline or control. <i>Ungoverned youth.</i>
uninhibited	Not inhibited or restrained. <i>Fits of uninhibited laughter.</i>
unquenchable	Impossible to quench. <i>Unquenchable thirst.</i>
unrestrained	Marked by uncontrolled excitement or emotion. <i>A display of unrestrained delight.</i>
unrestricted	Never having had security classification. <i>Unrestricted access to both military bases.</i>
unstoppable	Not capable of being stopped. <i>As unstoppable as the wind.</i>

<u>infinite</u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>Intimations of the infinite.</i>
interminable	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>We got bogged down in interminable discussions.</i>
<u>limitless</u>	Without limits in extent or size or quantity. <i>Limitless vastness of our solar system.</i>
measureless	Without limits in extent or size or quantity. <i>Otto had measureless charm.</i>
overweening	Unrestrained, especially with regard to feelings. <i>Had a witty but overweening manner.</i>
perpetual	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>The perpetual struggle to maintain standards in a democracy.</i>
renewable	Capable of being renewed; replaceable. <i>Production costs for the renewables are higher than for coal oil or gas.</i>
<u>spontaneous</u>	Happening or arising without apparent external cause. <i>The audience broke into spontaneous applause.</i>
<u>unbounded</u>	Having or appearing to have no limits. <i>Unbounded enthusiasm.</i>
<u>unchecked</u>	Not restrained or controlled. <i>Prices rose unchecked hitting the poor worst of all.</i>
unfettered	Unrestrained or uninhibited. <i>Unfettered artistic genius.</i>
<u>uninhibited</u>	Expressing one's feelings or thoughts unselfconsciously and without restraint. <i>Fits of uninhibited laughter.</i>

unlimited	That cannot be entirely consumed or used up. <i>To start with a theory of unlimited freedom is to end up with unlimited despotism.</i>
unobstructed	Free from impediment or obstruction or hindrance. <i>An unobstructed view of the traffic lights.</i>
<u>unorganized</u>	Not organized. <i>Unorganized data.</i>
unreserved	Not set apart for a particular purpose or booked in advance. <i>A tall unreserved young man.</i>
<u>unrestrained</u>	Not subject to restraint. <i>A display of unrestrained delight.</i>
unrestricted	Not restricted or modified in meaning. <i>I had unrestricted access.</i>
