
Unbroken as an Adjective

- Marked by continuous or uninterrupted extension in space or time or sequence.
- (especially of promises or contracts) not violated or disregarded.
- (of a record) not surpassed.
- Not broken; whole and intact; in one piece.
- Not broken, fractured, or damaged.
- (of farmland) not plowed.
- Not subdued or trained for service or use.
- (of a horse) not tamed or accustomed to being ridden.
- (of land) not cultivated.
- Not plowed.
- Not violated or disregarded.
