- *(of a record) not surpassed.*
- *Not broken; whole and intact; in one piece.*
- *Not broken, fractured, or damaged.*
- *(of farmland) not plowed.*
- *Not subdued or trained for service or use.*
- *(of a horse) not tamed or accustomed to being ridden.*
- *(of land) not cultivated.*
- *Not plowed.*
- *Not violated or disregarded.*

*A **continuous** line has no gaps or breaks in it.*

endless

Having no known beginning and presumably no end.
*An **endless** chain.*

entire

Constituting the undiminished entirety lacking nothing essential especially not damaged.
*An ideological system with which he is in **entire** agreement.*

matchless	Eminent beyond or above comparison. <i>Matchless beauty.</i>
never-ending	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.
ongoing	Currently happening. <i>An ongoing economic crisis.</i>
perfect	Of a tense denoting a completed action or a state or habitual action which began in the past The perfect tense is formed in English with have or has and the past participle as in they have eaten and they have been eating present perfect they had eaten past perfect and they will have eaten future perfect. <i>All that Joseph said made perfect sense to me.</i>
perpetual	(of an investment) having no fixed maturity date; irredeemable. <i>A perpetual bond.</i>
second to none	Coming next after the first in position in space or time or degree or magnitude.
sound	(of sleep) deep and complete. <i>He has a sound understanding of the law.</i>
supreme	Final or last in your life or progress. <i>A supreme tribunal.</i>
unbeaten	Not conquered. <i>They were the only side to remain unbeaten.</i>
unceasing	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>Man s unceasing warfare with drought and isolation.</i>
undamaged	Not harmed or damaged. <i>Buildings undamaged during the war.</i>
undefeated	Not defeated, especially in a battle or other contest. <i>The undefeated champion.</i>

undomesticated	Unaccustomed to home life. <i>A few undomesticated horses left.</i>
unharmed	Not injured. <i>All the hostages were released unharmed.</i>
unimpaired	Not damaged or diminished in any respect. <i>Unimpaired mobility.</i>
uninterrupted	Continuing in time or space without interruption. <i>An uninterrupted flow of traffic.</i>
<u>unmatched</u>	Eminent beyond or above comparison. <i>Infamy unmatched in the Western world.</i>
unploughed	(of an area of land) not having been ploughed. <i>An unploughed field.</i>
unplowed	(of farmland) not plowed. <i>Unplowed fields.</i>
<u>unremitting</u>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Unremitting demands of hunger.</i>
unrivalled	Eminent beyond or above comparison. <i>The paper's coverage of foreign news is unrivalled.</i>
unscathed	Not injured. <i>I came through all those perils unscathed.</i>
unspoiled	Not left to spoil. <i>One of the best stretches of unspoiled coastline in the UK.</i>
unsubdued	Not brought under control. <i>London remained unsubdued.</i>
<u>unsurpassed</u>	Not capable of being improved on. <i>The quality of workmanship is unsurpassed.</i>
untamed	In a natural state; not tamed or domesticated or cultivated. <i>Nepal was stunning with its wild untamed landscape.</i>
<u>untouched</u>	Not influenced or affected- V.L.Parrington. <i>Annabel pushed aside her untouched plate.</i>
<u>whole</u>	Acting together as a single undiversified whole. <i>Gave his whole attention.</i>
wild	Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation. <i>Performing in Hollywood was beyond my wildest dreams.</i>

Forming an unbroken whole; without interruption.
*The whole performance is enacted in one **continuous** movement.*

durable

(of a person) having endurance.
*The **durable** Smith lasted the full eight rounds.*

endless

(of a belt, chain, or tape) having the ends joined to form a loop allowing continuous action.
***Endless** loop cassette tapes.*

ever

At all times all the time and on every occasion.
*They lived happily **ever** after.*

every

(used of count nouns) each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without exception.
***Every** two hours.*

The complete set of genes or genetic material present in a cell or organism.
*The human **genome** contains approximately three billion chemical base pairs.*

incessant

(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption.
*The **incessant** beat of the music.*

incessantly	With unflagging resolve. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
intact	(used of domestic animals) sexually competent. <i>The vase remained intact despite rough handling.</i>
<u>nonstop</u>	(of a journey especially a flight) occurring without stops. <i>How many nonstops are there to Dallas.</i>
<u>permanent</u>	Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely. <i>Literature of permanent value.</i>
perpetual	(of an investment) having no fixed maturity date; irredeemable. <i>Hell s perpetual fires.</i>
preserved	Prevented from decaying or spoiling and prepared for future use. <i>Preserved manuscripts.</i>
<u>secure</u>	Assure payment of. <i>He was secure that nothing will be held against him.</i>
sequential	In regular succession without gaps. <i>A series of sequential steps.</i>
seriatim	Taking one subject after another in regular order; point by point. <i>It is proposed to deal with these matters seriatim.</i>
<u>sober</u>	Become sober after excessive alcohol consumption. <i>His expression sobbered her.</i>
sobriety	Moderation in or abstinence from alcohol or other drugs. <i>The price of beer compelled me to maintain a certain level of sobriety.</i>
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Man s unceasing warfare with drought and isolation.</i>
<u>unchanging</u>	Conforming to the same principles or course of action over time. <i>The party stood for unchanging principles.</i>
undamaged	Not harmed or spoiled; sound. <i>Buildings undamaged during the war.</i>
unharmmed	Not harmed; uninjured. <i>All the hostages were released unharmmed.</i>
unhurt	Free from danger or injury. <i>He was shaken but unhurt after being pelted with cans and bottles.</i>
unimpaired	Not damaged or diminished in any respect. <i>His speech remained unimpaired.</i>
uninjured	(of a person or part of the body) not harmed or damaged. <i>They escaped uninjured when their homes were hit.</i>

uninterrupted	Having undisturbed continuity. <i>A convalescent needs uninterrupted sleep.</i>
<u>unremitting</u>	Never relaxing or slackening; incessant. <i>Unremitting drizzle.</i>
unscathed	Not injured. <i>I came through all those perils unscathed.</i>
