- *Being unsettled or in doubt or dependent on chance.*



## Synonyms of "Uncertainties" as a noun (7 Words)

<b>doubt</b>	A feeling of uncertainty or lack of conviction. <i>Some <b>doubt</b> has been cast upon the authenticity of this account.</i>
<b>doubtfulness</b>	The state of being unsure of something.
<b>dubiety</b>	The state or quality of being doubtful; uncertainty. <i>His enemies made much of the <b>dubiety</b> of his paternity.</i>
<b>dubiousness</b>	The state of being unsure of something. <i>The <b>dubiousness</b> of his claim.</i>
<b>incertitude</b>	The state of being unsure of something. <i>Some schools broke down under the stresses of policy <b>incertitude</b>.</i>
<b>precariousness</b>	The state of being uncertain or dependent on chance. <i>The <b>precariousness</b> of his income.</i>
<b>uncertainness</b>	Being unsettled or in doubt or dependent on chance.

## Associations of "Uncertainties" (30 Words)

<b>agnostic</b>	Relating to agnostics or agnosticism. <i>Many common file formats JPEG MP3 etc are platform <b>agnostic</b>.</i>
<b><u>ambiguity</u></b>	Unclearness by virtue of having more than one meaning. <i>We can detect no <b>ambiguity</b> in this section of the Act.</i>
<b>ambiguous</b>	Not clear or decided. <i><b>Ambiguous</b> words.</i>
<b>ambiguously</b>	In an ambiguous manner. <i>The new clause is <b>ambiguously</b> worded.</i>
<b><u>ambivalent</u></b>	Uncertain or unable to decide about what course to follow. <i>Some loved her some hated her few were <b>ambivalent</b> about her.</i>
<b><u>caprice</u></b>	A sudden and unaccountable change of mood or behaviour. <i>A land where men were ruled by law and not by <b>caprice</b>.</i>
<b><u>doubt</u></b>	Consider unlikely or have doubts about. <i>They had <b>doubts</b> that they would ever win.</i>

<b>doubtful</b>	Feeling uncertain about something. <i>It was <b>doubtful</b> whether she would be admitted.</i>
<b><u>dubious</u></b>	Not convinced. <i>They admitted the force of my argument but remained <b>dubious</b>.</i>
<b>equivocal</b>	Open to more than one interpretation; ambiguous. <i>Aliens of <b>equivocal</b> loyalty.</i>
<b>imprecise</b>	Lacking exactness and accuracy of expression or detail. <i>The witness could give only vague and <b>imprecise</b> descriptions.</i>
<b>imprecision</b>	Lack of exactness or accuracy. <i>All scientific measurements come with some degree of <b>imprecision</b>.</i>
<b>inconclusive</b>	Not leading to a firm conclusion or result; not ending doubt or dispute. <i>The <b>inconclusive</b> committee vote.</i>
<b>incredulity</b>	The state of being unwilling or unable to believe something. <i>He stared down the street in <b>incredulity</b>.</i>
<b><u>incredulous</u></b>	(of a person or their manner) unwilling or unable to believe something. <i>An <b>incredulous</b> gasp.</i>
<b>indeterminate</b>	Not exactly known, established, or defined. <i>An <b>indeterminate</b> future.</i>
<b>inexact</b>	Not exact. <i>An <b>inexact</b> description.</i>
<b><u>shady</u></b>	Unscrupulous. <i>They sprawled under a <b>shady</b> carob tree.</i>
<b>skeptic</b>	Someone who habitually doubts accepted beliefs.
<b><u>skeptical</u></b>	Marked by or given to doubt. <i>A <b>skeptical</b> listener.</i>
<b>skepticism</b>	The disbelief in any claims of ultimate knowledge.
<b><u>suspicious</u></b>	Having the belief or impression that someone is involved in an illegal or dishonest activity. <i>Police were called when staff became <b>suspicious</b>.</i>
<b>suspiciously</b>	With suspicion. <i>The group was <b>suspiciously</b> quiet about their activities.</i>
<b><u>uncertain</u></b>	Not able to be relied on; not known or definite. <i>Everything is <b>uncertain</b> about the army.</i>
<b><u>unclear</u></b>	Having or feeling doubt or confusion. <i>Their future remains <b>unclear</b>.</i>
<b><u>undecided</u></b>	Characterized by indecision. <i>Our position on this bill is still <b>undecided</b>.</i>

- vagary** An unexpected and inexplicable change in something (in a situation or a person's behavior, etc).  
*The vagaries of the weather.*
- vague** Lacking clarity or distinctness.  
*Many patients suffer **vague** symptoms.*
- vaguely** In a way that is uncertain, indefinite or unclear; roughly.  
*He **vaguely** remembered talking to her once.*
- whim** An odd or fanciful or capricious idea.  
*She bought it on a **whim**.*
