aonor	A feeling of uncertainty or lack of conviction. Some doubt has been cast upon the authenticity of this account.
doubtfulness	The state of being unsure of something.
απριστή	The state or quality of being doubtful; uncertainty. <i>His enemies made much of the dubiety of his paternity.</i>
dubiousness	The state of being unsure of something. The dubiousness of his claim.
incertitude	The state of being unsure of something. Some schools broke down under the stresses of policy incertitude .
precariousness	The state of being uncertain or dependent on chance. The precariousness of his income.
uncertainness	Being unsettled or in doubt or dependent on chance.

Associations of "Uncertainties" (30 Words)

agnostic	Relating to agnostics or agnosticism. Many common file formats JPEG MP3 etc are platform agnostic .
<u>ambiguity</u>	Unclearness by virtue of having more than one meaning. We can detect no ambiguity in this section of the Act.
ambiguous	Not clear or decided. <i>Ambiguous</i> words.
ambiguously	In an ambiguous manner. The new clause is ambiguously worded.
<u>ambivalent</u>	Uncertain or unable to decide about what course to follow. Some loved her some hated her few were ambivalent about her.
<u>caprice</u>	A sudden and unaccountable change of mood or behaviour. A land where men were ruled by law and not by caprice .
<u>doubt</u>	Consider unlikely or have doubts about. They had doubt s that they would ever win.



doubtful	Feeling uncertain about something. It was doubtful whether she would be admitted.
<u>dubious</u>	Not convinced. They admitted the force of my argument but remained dubious .
equivocal	Open to more than one interpretation; ambiguous. Aliens of equivocal loyalty.
imprecise	Lacking exactness and accuracy of expression or detail. <i>The witness could give only vague and imprecise descriptions.</i>
imprecision	Lack of exactness or accuracy. All scientific measurements come with some degree of imprecision .
inconclusive	Not leading to a firm conclusion or result; not ending doubt or dispute. <i>The inconclusive committee vote.</i>
incredulity	The state of being unwilling or unable to believe something. <i>He stared down the street in incredulity.</i>
<u>incredulous</u>	(of a person or their manner) unwilling or unable to believe something. An incredulous gasp.
indeterminate	Not exactly known, established, or defined. An indeterminate future.
inexact	Not exact. An inexact description.
<u>shady</u>	Unscrupulous. They sprawled under a shady carob tree.
skeptic	Someone who habitually doubts accepted beliefs.
<u>skeptical</u>	Marked by or given to doubt. A skeptical listener.
skepticism	The disbelief in any claims of ultimate knowledge.
<u>suspicious</u>	Having the belief or impression that someone is involved in an illegal or dishonest activity. <i>Police were called when staff became suspicious</i> .
suspiciously	With suspicion. The group was suspiciously quiet about their activities.
<u>uncertain</u>	Not able to be relied on; not known or definite. <i>Everything is uncertain about the army.</i>
<u>unclear</u>	Having or feeling doubt or confusion. Their future remains unclear .
<u>undecided</u>	Characterized by indecision. <i>Our position on this bill is still undecided.</i>



vagary	An unexpected and inexplicable change in something (in a situation or a person's behavior, etc. <i>The vagaries of the weather.</i>
<u>vague</u>	Lacking clarity or distinctness. Many patients suffer vague symptoms.
vaguely	In a way that is uncertain, indefinite or unclear; roughly. He vaguely remembered talking to her once.
<u>whim</u>	An odd or fanciful or capricious idea. She bouaht it on a whim .
