<b>cast-iron</b>	Extremely robust.
<b>changeless</b>	Not subject or susceptible to change or variation in form or quality or nature. <i><b>Changeless</b> truths.</i>

<b>constant</b>	(of a person) unchangingly faithful and dependable. <i>A <b>constant</b> lover.</i>
<b>decided</b>	Recognizable; marked. <i>At a distinct or <b>decided</b> disadvantage.</i>
<b>deep-rooted</b>	Deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held.
<b>enduring</b>	Unceasing. <i>He formed a number of <b>enduring</b> relationships with women.</i>
<b>established</b>	Brought about or set up or accepted especially long established. <i>An <b>established</b> precedent.</i>
<b>eternal</b>	Used to emphasize expressions of admiration, gratitude, etc. <i>The wait seemed <b>eternal</b>.</i>
<b>firm</b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution not shakable. <i><b>Firm</b> convictions.</i>
<b>fixed</b>	Fixed and unmoving Connor Cruise O Brien. <i>Loans are provided for a <b>fixed</b> period.</i>
<b>hard and fast</b>	Given to excessive indulgence of bodily appetites especially for intoxicating liquors.
<b>immutable</b>	Not subject or susceptible to change or variation in form or quality or nature. <i>The <b>immutable</b> laws of nature.</i>
<b>indestructible</b>	Not easily destroyed. <i><b>Indestructible</b> plastic containers.</i>
<b>ineradicable</b>	Unable to be destroyed or removed. <i><b>Ineradicable</b> superstitions.</i>
<b>invariable</b>	Never changing. <i>An <b>invariable</b> temperature.</i>
<b>invariant</b>	Unvarying in nature. <i>The pattern of cell divisions was found to be <b>invariant</b>.</i>
<b>irreversible</b>	Not able to be undone or altered. <i><b>Irreversible</b> momentum toward revolution.</i>
<b>lasting</b>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A <b>lasting</b> happy marriage.</i>
<b>lifelong</b>	Continuing through life. <i>A <b>lifelong</b> friend.</i>
<b>permanent</b>	Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely. <i>Damage was not thought to be <b>permanent</b>.</i>

<b>perpetual</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>A <b>perpetual</b> bond.</i>
<b>set</b>	Set down according to a plan. <i>We are <b>set</b> to go at any time.</i>
<b>set in stone</b>	Fixed and unmoving- Connor Cruise O'Brien.
<b>unalterable</b>	Not able to be changed. <i>An <b>unalterable</b> truth.</i>
<b>unfading</b>	Of an imaginary flower that never fades. <i>Then with smile <b>unfading</b> he handed the envelope to Lewis.</i>
<b>unvarying</b>	Unvarying in nature. <i>Principles of <b>unvarying</b> validity.</i>

<b>changeless</b>	Not subject or susceptible to change or variation in form or quality or nature. <i><b>Changeless</b> truths.</i>
<b>confirmed</b>	(of a person) firmly established in a particular habit, belief, or way of life and unlikely to change their ways. <i>Received <b>confirmed</b> reports of casualties.</i>
<b>consistent</b>	In agreement or consistent or reliable. <i>Bituminous coal is often treated as a <b>consistent</b> and homogeneous product.</i>
<b>constant</b>	A number representing a quantity assumed to have a fixed value in a specified mathematical context. <i>A <b>constant</b> friend.</i>
<b>continually</b>	Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly. <i>I was <b>continually</b> moving around.</i>

<b><u>durable</u></b>	Very long lasting. <i>Porcelain enamel is strong and <b>durable</b>.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Countless; innumerable. <i><b>Endless</b> ocean wastes.</i>
<b><u>enduring</u></b>	Unceasing. <i>He formed a number of <b>enduring</b> relationships with women.</i>
<b>equable</b>	Not easily disturbed or angered; calm and even-tempered. <i>An <b>equable</b> temper.</i>
<b><u>eternal</u></b>	(of truths, values, or questions) valid for all time; essentially unchanging. <i>The wait seemed <b>eternal</b>.</i>
<b>eternity</b>	A period of time that seems very long, especially on account of being tedious or annoying. <i>Symbolic inklings of <b>eternity</b>.</i>
<b>immutable</b>	Not subject or susceptible to change or variation in form or quality or nature. <i>The <b>immutable</b> laws of nature.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Night and day we live with the <b>incessant</b> noise of the city.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>indelible</b>	Cannot be removed or erased. <i>An <b>indelible</b> stain.</i>
<b>indestructible</b>	Not easily destroyed. <i><b>Indestructible</b> plastic containers.</i>
<b>ineradicable</b>	Not able to be destroyed or rooted out. <i><b>Ineradicable</b> superstitions.</i>
<b>invariable</b>	Never changing. <i>His routine was <b>invariable</b>.</i>
<b><u>irrevocably</u></b>	In an irrevocable manner. <i>Our environment will be <b>irrevocably</b> damaged.</i>
<b><u>lasting</u></b>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A <b>lasting</b> happy marriage.</i>
<b>permanence</b>	The state or quality of lasting or remaining unchanged indefinitely. <i>The clarity and <b>permanence</b> of the dyes.</i>
<b>permanency</b>	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
<b><u>permanent</u></b>	A series of waves in the hair made by applying heat and chemicals. <i><b>Permanent</b> address.</i>

<b>perpetual</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>Deep caves in <b>perpetual</b> darkness.</i>
<b><u>stable</u></b>	Shelter in a stable. <i>Specially designed dinghies that are very <b>stable</b>.</i>
<b>steadfast</b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i><b>Steadfast</b> loyalty.</i>
<b><u>steady</u></b>	Support or hold steady and make steadfast with or as if with a brace. <i>I took a deep breath to <b>steady</b> my nerves.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.</i>
<b><u>unchanging</u></b>	Conforming to the same principles or course of action over time. <i>The party stood for <b>unchanging</b> principles.</i>
