fixed Of a number having a fixed and unchanging value.

Loans are provided for a **fixed** period.

hard and fast Dried out.

prearranged Arranged or agreed upon in advance.

Did she have a **prearranged** meeting.

predetermined Set in advance.

At a **predetermined** time.

prescribed Fixed or established especially by order or command.

In **prescribed** order.

scheduled Planned or scheduled for some certain time or times.

The **scheduled** meeting.

specified Clearly and explicitly stated.

Meals are at **specified** times.

unaltered Remaining the same; unchanged.

Persisting **unaltered** through time.

hush Wash by removing particles.

Management took steps to **hush** up the dangers.

An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome.

He will always be one of the **immortal**s of soccer.

inactivity The state of being inactive.

People are frustrated with government **inactivity**.

A pause during which things are calm or activities are diminished.

The rhythm of the boat **lull**ed her to sleep.

Sounded or spoken in a tone unvarying in pitch.

monotonous

Her slurred monotonous speech.

nonviolence Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.

remain Stay the same remain in a certain state.

The hostility **remain**ed long after they made up.

reticent Reluctant to draw attention to yourself.

She was extremely **reticent** about her personal affairs.

An expanse of clear sky or calm sea.

Serene Serene certainty.

silence Complete absence of sound.

We finished our meal in **silence**.

Used as a direction in music to be played relatively softly.

Speak **softly** but carry a big stick.

static Concerned with or producing or caused by static electricity.

She felt the tingle of **static** from the cat s fur.

stationary Not capable of being moved.

Stationary machinery.

Firm and dependable especially in loyalty.

steadfast

Steadfast loyalty.



still Make calm or still.

The **still** of the night.

stillness Calmness without winds.

Absolute **stillness** greeted our gaze.

Too long, slow, or dull; tiresome or monotonous.

A **tedious** journey.

Unaffected by time.

Antiques add to the **timeless** atmosphere of the dining room.

tranquil Free from disturbance; calm.

Tranquil life in the country.

tranquilize Make calm or still.

unaltered Remaining in an original state.

Many buildings survive unaltered.

unvaried Lacking variety.

A plain **unvaried** diet.
