Synonyms of "Unchanged" as an adjective (15 Words)

agreed	United by being of the same opinion. <i>Agreed in their distrust of authority.</i>
appointed	Selected for a job. <i>At the time appointed or the appointed time.</i>
arranged	Deliberately arranged for effect. <i>The carefully arranged chessmen.</i>
decided	(of a legal case) having been resolved. <i>He quotes from decided cases.</i>

defined	Clearly characterized or delimited. <i>Hills defined against the evening sky.</i>
determined	Determined or decided upon as by an authority. <i>Date and place are already determined.</i>
established	Brought about or set up or accepted especially long established. <i>The established social order.</i>
fixed	Of a number having a fixed and unchanging value. <i>Loans are provided for a fixed period.</i>
hard and fast	Dried out.
prearranged	Arranged or agreed upon in advance. <i>Did she have a prearranged meeting.</i>
predetermined	Set in advance. <i>At a predetermined time.</i>
prescribed	Fixed or established especially by order or command. <i>In prescribed order.</i>
scheduled	Planned or scheduled for some certain time or times. <i>The scheduled meeting.</i>
specified	Clearly and explicitly stated. <i>Meals are at specified times.</i>
unaltered	Remaining the same; unchanged. <i>Persisting unaltered through time.</i>

Usage Examples of "Unchanged" as an adjective

- *The causes that produced them have remained unchanged.*
- *An unchanged side for tonight's home game.*

boring	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. <i>I ve got a boring job in an office.</i>
calm	Make calm or still. <i>Spoke in a calm voice.</i>
coexistence	The state or fact of living or existing at the same time or in the same place. <i>A harmonious coexistence between wildlife and livestock.</i>
collected	Brought together in one place. <i>The witness remained collected throughout the cross examination.</i>

constancy	The tendency for perceived objects to give rise to very similar perceptual experiences in spite of wide variations in the conditions of observation. <i>The constancy of the tradition.</i>
constant	A situation that does not change. <i>A man constant in adherence to his ideals.</i>
everlasting	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>Life everlasting.</i>
humdrum	Tediously repetitious or lacking in variety. <i>Humdrum routine work.</i>
<u>hush</u>	Wash by removing particles. <i>Management took steps to hush up the dangers.</i>
<u>immortal</u>	An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>He will always be one of the immortals of soccer.</i>
inactivity	The state of being inactive. <i>People are frustrated with government inactivity.</i>
lull	A pause during which things are calm or activities are diminished. <i>The rhythm of the boat lulled her to sleep.</i>
<u>monotonous</u>	Sounded or spoken in a tone unvarying in pitch. <i>Her slurred monotonous speech.</i>
nonviolence	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
<u>remain</u>	Stay the same remain in a certain state. <i>The hostility remained long after they made up.</i>
<u>reticent</u>	Reluctant to draw attention to yourself. <i>She was extremely reticent about her personal affairs.</i>
<u>serene</u>	An expanse of clear sky or calm sea. <i>Serene certainty.</i>
silence	Complete absence of sound. <i>We finished our meal in silence.</i>
<u>softly</u>	Used as a direction in music to be played relatively softly. <i>Speak softly but carry a big stick.</i>
<u>static</u>	Concerned with or producing or caused by static electricity. <i>She felt the tingle of static from the cat s fur.</i>
<u>stationary</u>	Not capable of being moved. <i>Stationary machinery.</i>
steadfast	Firm and dependable especially in loyalty. <i>Steadfast loyalty.</i>

still	Make calm or still. <i>The still of the night.</i>
<u>stillness</u>	Calmness without winds. <i>Absolute stillness greeted our gaze.</i>
<u>tedious</u>	Too long, slow, or dull; tiresome or monotonous. <i>A tedious journey.</i>
<u>timeless</u>	Unaffected by time. <i>Antiques add to the timeless atmosphere of the dining room.</i>
<u>tranquil</u>	Free from disturbance; calm. <i>Tranquil life in the country.</i>
tranquilize	Make calm or still.
unaltered	Remaining in an original state. <i>Many buildings survive unaltered.</i>
unvaried	Lacking variety. <i>A plain unvaried diet.</i>
