- *Showing little if any change.*

Synonyms of "Unchanging" as an adjective (14 Words)

consistent	Marked by an orderly logical and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>Testimony consistent with the known facts.</i>
constant	Steadfast in purpose or devotion or affection. <i>Maintained a constant temperature.</i>
eternal	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>Eternal truths of art and life.</i>
even	Being level or straight or regular and without variation as e g in shape or texture or being in the same plane or at the same height as something else i e even with. <i>Any number doubled is even.</i>

fixed	Having a fixed and unchanging value. <i>The fixed assumptions of the Cold War.</i>
<u>permanent</u>	Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely. <i>He s in a permanent state of rage.</i>
perpetual	(of an investment) having no fixed maturity date; irredeemable. <i>Deep caves in perpetual darkness.</i>
<u>predictable</u>	Always behaving or occurring in the way expected. <i>The market is volatile and never predictable.</i>
regular	Relating to a person who does something regularly. <i>A regular job.</i>
<u>stable</u>	(of an object or structure) not likely to give way or overturn; firmly fixed. <i>The economy is stable.</i>
<u>static</u>	Relating to statics. <i>A static population.</i>
<u>steady</u>	(of a ship) moving without deviation from its course. <i>A steady decline in the national birth rate.</i>
<u>uniform</u>	Denoting a garment forming part of a person s uniform. <i>A uniform package of amenities at a choice of hotels.</i>
unvarying	Unvarying in nature. <i>Principles of unvarying validity.</i>

Usage Examples of "Unchanging" as an adjective

Associations of "Unchanging" (30 Words)

<u>ceaseless</u>	Constant and unending. <i>The ceaseless thunder of surf.</i>
changeless	Remaining the same for indefinitely long times. <i>Changeless truths.</i>
<u>coherent</u>	Capable of thinking and expressing yourself in a clear and consistent manner. <i>They failed to develop a coherent economic strategy.</i>
<u>consistent</u>	Sometimes followed by with in agreement or consistent or reliable. <i>A consistent explanation.</i>

constant	A number representing a quantity assumed to have a fixed value in a specified mathematical context. <i>A constant lover.</i>
continual	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i>Continual is often used interchangeably with continuous.</i>
continually	Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly. <i>I was continually moving around.</i>
continuous	Continuing in time or space without interruption- James Jeans. <i>A continuous rearrangement of electrons in the solar atoms results in the emission of light.</i>
endless	(of a belt, chain, or tape) having the ends joined to form a loop allowing continuous action. <i>Endless debates.</i>
equable	Not varying or fluctuating greatly. <i>He could look sterner than his equable temperament would suggest.</i>
ever	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>They lived happily ever after.</i>
everlasting	Any of various plants of various genera of the family Compositae having flowers that can be dried without loss of form or color. <i>An everlasting reminder of this evening.</i>
immutable	Unchanging over time or unable to be changed. <i>The view of that time was that all species were immutable created by God.</i>
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Night and day we live with the incessant noise of the city.</i>
incessantly	Without interruption; constantly. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
indestructible	Very long lasting. <i>Indestructible plastic containers.</i>
invariable	A quantity that does not vary. <i>His invariable courtesy.</i>
invariant	Never changing. <i>The pattern of cell divisions was found to be invariant.</i>
lasting	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A long lasting friendship.</i>
nonstop	A flight made without intermediate stops between source and destination. <i>How many nonstops are there to Dallas.</i>

<u>permanent</u>	A series of waves in the hair made by applying heat and chemicals. <i>A permanent ban on the dumping of radioactive waste at sea.</i>
perpetual	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>He grows perpetual flowering carnations.</i>
<u>perpetuity</u>	A bond or other security with no fixed maturity date. <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i>
persistent	(of chemicals or radioactivity) remaining within the environment for a long time after introduction. <i>PCBs are persistent environmental contaminants.</i>
<u>steady</u>	Support or hold steady and make steadfast with or as if with a brace. <i>Steady yourself.</i>
sustained	Continuing for an extended period or without interruption. <i>Several years of sustained economic growth.</i>
unceasing	Not coming to an end; continuous. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>
<u>unchangeable</u>	Not liable to variation or able to be altered. <i>The unchangeable seasons.</i>
uninterrupted	Without a break in continuity. <i>A convalescent needs uninterrupted sleep.</i>
<u>unremitting</u>	Never relaxing or slackening; incessant. <i>Unremitting demands of hunger.</i>
