boundless	Seemingly boundless in amount number degree or especially extent. <i>Enthusiasts who devote boundless energy to their hobby.</i>
out of control	Outside or external.
out of hand	Out of power; especially having been unsuccessful in an election.
unbounded	Seemingly boundless in amount, number, degree, or especially extent. <i>Unbounded enthusiasm.</i>
unbridled	Not restrained or controlled. <i>Unbridled lust.</i>

unconfined	(of joy or excitement) very great. <i>Joy was unconfined.</i>
unconstrained	Not restricted or limited. <i>Unconstrained growth.</i>
uncontrollable	Impossible to repress or control. <i>Uncontrollable children.</i>
uncontrolled	Not controlled. <i>In mice the growth was uncontrolled and resembled cancer.</i>
uncurbed	Not restrained or controlled. <i>Their activities continue to be largely uncurbed.</i>
undisciplined	Not subjected to discipline. <i>The paintings were the work of an undisciplined talent.</i>
unfettered	Unrestrained or uninhibited. <i>Unfettered artistic genius.</i>
ungoverned	Not restrained or controlled. <i>The fatal end of an ungoverned passion.</i>
unhampered	Not impeded or encumbered. <i>A priest unhampered by scruple.</i>
unimpeded	Not slowed or prevented. <i>An unimpeded view across the headland.</i>
uninhibited	Expressing one's feelings or thoughts unselfconsciously and without restraint. <i>Uninhibited exuberance.</i>
unlimited	Without reservation or exception. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited.</i>
unrestricted	Not restricted or exclusive. <i>Unrestricted access to both military bases.</i>
unshackled	Not bound by shackles and chains. <i>He had handcuffs on his wrists but his feet were unshackled.</i>
unsuppressed	Not restrained or repressed. <i>Unsuppressed rage.</i>
untrammelled	Not confined or limited. <i>A mind untrammelled by convention.</i>

- *An unchecked temper.*

- *Prices rose unchecked, hitting the poor worst of all.*

forever	Continually. <i>These puppies need a forever home.</i>
grinding	Material resulting from the process of grinding. <i>The roasting and grinding of grain usually barley for use in brewing.</i>
illimitable	Without limits or an end. <i>The illimitable human capacity for evil.</i>
incessant	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>Night and day we live with the incessant noise of the city.</i>
incessantly	Without interruption; constantly. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
indefinitely	To an indefinite extent; for an indefinite time. <i>An indefinitely large number of channels.</i>

<u>infinite</u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>Infinite wealth.</i>
interminable	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>An interminable sermon.</i>
<u>limitless</u>	Having no limits in range or scope. <i>Our resources are not limitless.</i>
measureless	Without limits in extent or size or quantity. <i>Otto had measureless charm.</i>
perpetual	Never ending or changing. <i>Hell s perpetual fires.</i>
<u>perpetuity</u>	A restriction making an interest in land inalienable perpetually or for a period beyond certain limits fixed by law. <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i>
<u>unbounded</u>	Having or appearing to have no limits. <i>The possibilities are unbounded.</i>
<u>unbridled</u>	Uncontrolled; unconstrained. <i>A moment of unbridled ambition.</i>
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Man s unceasing warfare with drought and isolation.</i>
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
unfettered	Unrestrained or uninhibited. <i>Unfettered artistic genius.</i>
<u>uninhibited</u>	Not inhibited or restrained. <i>Fits of uninhibited laughter.</i>
unlimited	Without reservation or exception. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited.</i>
<u>unrestrained</u>	Not subject to restraint. <i>A display of unrestrained delight.</i>
unrestricted	Not restricted or exclusive. <i>I had unrestricted access.</i>
