boundless	Seemingly boundless in amount number degree or especially extent. Enthusiasts who devote boundless energy to their hobby.
out of control	Outside or external.
out of hand	Out of power; especially having been unsuccessful in an election.
<u>unbounded</u>	Seemingly boundless in amount, number, degree, or especially extent. <i>Unbounded enthusiasm</i> .
<u>unbridled</u>	Not restrained or controlled. Unbridled lust.



unconfined	(of joy or excitement) very great. Joy was unconfined .
unconstrained	Not restricted or limited. Unconstrained growth.
<u>uncontrollable</u>	Impossible to repress or control. Uncontrollable children.
<u>uncontrolled</u>	Not controlled. In mice the growth was uncontrolled and resembled cancer.
uncurbed	Not restrained or controlled. Their activities continue to be largely uncurbed .
undisciplined	Not subjected to discipline. The paintings were the work of an undisciplined talent.
unfettered	Unrestrained or uninhibited. Unfettered artistic genius.
ungoverned	Not restrained or controlled. The fatal end of an ungoverned passion.
unhampered	Not impeded or encumbered. A priest unhampered by scruple.
<u>unimpeded</u>	Not slowed or prevented. An unimpeded view across the headland.
<u>uninhibited</u>	Expressing one's feelings or thoughts unselfconsciously and without restraint. <i>Uninhibited</i> exuberance.
unlimited	Without reservation or exception. Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited .
unrestricted	Not restricted or exclusive. Unrestricted access to both military bases.
unshackled	Not bound by shackles and chains. <i>He had handcuffs on his wrists but his feet were unshackled.</i>
unsuppressed	Not restrained or repressed. Unsuppressed rage.
untrammelled	Not confined or limited. A mind untrammelled by convention.

interminable	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. An interminable sermon.
<u>limitless</u>	Having no limits in range or scope. <i>Our resources are not limitless.</i>
measureless	Without limits in extent or size or quantity. <i>Otto had measureless charm.</i>
perpetual	Never ending or changing. <i>Hell s perpetual fires.</i>
<u>perpetuity</u>	A restriction making an interest in land inalienable perpetually or for a period beyond certain limits fixed by law. <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i>
<u>unbounded</u>	Having or appearing to have no limits. <i>The possibilities are unbounded</i> .
<u>unbridled</u>	Uncontrolled; unconstrained. A moment of unbridled ambition.
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. Man s unceasing warfare with drought and isolation.
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
unfettered	Unrestrained or uninhibited. Unfettered artistic genius.
<u>uninhibited</u>	Not inhibited or restrained. Fits of uninhibited laughter.
unlimited	Without reservation or exception. Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited .
<u>unrestrained</u>	Not subject to restraint. A display of unrestrained delight.
unrestricted	Not restricted or exclusive. I had unrestricted access.
