unhampered Not impeded or encumbered.

A priest **unhampered** by scruple.

unimpeded Not slowed or prevented.

An **unimpeded** view across the headland.

Expressing one's feelings or thoughts unselfconsciously and without

uninhibited restraint.

Uninhibited exuberance.

unlimited Without reservation or exception.

Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not **unlimited**.

. . . Not restricted or exclusive.

unrestricted Unrestricted access to both military bases.

unshackled Not bound by shackles and chains.

He had handcuffs on his wrists but his feet were **unshackled**.

Not restrained or repressed.

unsuppressed *Unsuppressed* rage.

Not confined or limited.

untrammelled A mind untrammelled by convention.
