Thrown into a state of disarray or confusion.
*A patient who is mentally **disordered**.*

disorderly

Completely unordered and unpredictable and confusing.

Unable to plan one's activities efficiently.
*A **disorganized** enterprise.*

Unsettled in mind or opinion.
*The candidate s **doubtful** past.*

in doubt	Currently fashionable.
in the balance	Holding office.
incalculable	(of a person or their character) unpredictable. <i>An archive of incalculable value.</i>
indecipherable	Not able to be read or understood. Indecipherable handwriting.
indefinite	(of a word, inflection, or phrase) not determining the person, thing, time, etc. referred to. <i>He would not answer so indefinite a proposal.</i>
indeterminate	Not capable of being determined. <i>The equivocal or indeterminate objects painted by surrealists.</i>
jumbled	In utter disorder.
muddled	Not arranged in order; untidy. <i>The muddled display of pictures has been taken down.</i>
open to question	Affording free passage or view.
out of order	Outer or outlying.
outstanding	Distinguished from others in excellence. <i>Julian s outstanding debts.</i>
pending	Awaiting decision or settlement. <i>Nine cases were still pending.</i>
speculative	Engaged in, expressing, or based on conjecture rather than knowledge. <i>The bonuses cannot be put at risk due to some speculative investment.</i>
topsy-turvy	In utter disorder.
unascertained	Not confirmed or ascertained; unknown.
uncertain	Subject to change. <i>An uncertain smile.</i>
unconfirmed	Not confirmed as to truth or validity. <i>An unconfirmed letter of credit.</i>
undecided	Not yet having made a commitment. Undecided voters.
undecipherable	Not easily deciphered. <i>His almost undecipherable brogue.</i>
unestablished	Not established. <i>A reputation as yet unestablished.</i>

unforeseeable	Incapable of being anticipated. <i>Too many unforeseeable political consequences could arise from such a decision.</i>
unknown	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>An unknown source.</i>
unpredictable	Not able to be predicted; changeable. <i>An unpredictable or indeterminate future.</i>
unreadable	Too dull or difficult to be worth reading. <i>A heavy unreadable novel.</i>
unresolved	Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved. <i>A number of issues remain unresolved.</i>
unsettled	Still in doubt. <i>An unsettled state of mind.</i>
unsure	Lacking or indicating lack of confidence or assurance. <i>The date is unsure.</i>
untidy	Not inclined to keep one's possessions or appearance neat and in order. <i>The place was dreadfully untidy.</i>
up in the air	In readiness.
upset	Mildly physically distressed. <i>Too upset to say anything.</i>

Not clear or decided.
***Ambiguous** phrases.*

ambiguously

In an ambiguous manner.
*This letter is worded **ambiguously**.*

ambivalent

Having mixed feelings or contradictory ideas about something or someone.
*Was **ambivalent** about having children.*

blur

Make unclear indistinct or blurred.
*The haze **blurs** the hills.*

blurred

Indistinct or hazy in outline.
*A landscape of **blurred** outlines.*

<u>blurry</u>	Unable to perceive clear or sharp images. <i>Video projectors provided extremely blurry images.</i>
<u>dim</u>	Made dim or less bright. <i>Dimmed headlights.</i>
equivocal	Uncertain as a sign or indication. <i>Popularity is an equivocal crown.</i>
<u>equivocate</u>	Be deliberately ambiguous or unclear in order to mislead or withhold information. <i>The government have equivocated too often in the past.</i>
<u>evasive</u>	Directed towards avoidance or escape. <i>An evasive statement.</i>
<u>faint</u>	A sudden loss of consciousness. <i>She sent him a faint answering smile.</i>
<u>hazy</u>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>The picture we have of him is extremely hazy.</i>
illegibility	The quality of writing (print or handwriting) that cannot be deciphered.
imprecision	The quality of lacking precision. <i>All scientific measurements come with some degree of imprecision.</i>
indefinite	(of a word, inflection, or phrase) not determining the person, thing, time, etc. referred to. <i>In Greek the dual contrasts with the indefinite plural.</i>
indeterminate	Having a capacity for continuing to grow at the apex. <i>0 0 is an indeterminate form.</i>
indistinct	Not clear or sharply defined. <i>An indistinct memory.</i>
lightproof	Able to block out light completely. <i>A lightproof envelope.</i>
nebulous	Lacking definite form or limits. <i>Nebulous concepts like quality of life.</i>
noncommittal	Refusing to bind oneself to a particular course of action or view or the like. <i>Her boyfriend was noncommittal about their future together.</i>
<u>obscure</u>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>An obscure family.</i>
<u>opaque</u>	A substance for producing opaque areas on negatives. <i>Opaque windows of the jail.</i>

- puzzling** Not clear to the understanding.
*Only one very **puzzling** question remains unanswered.*
- subtlety** The quality of being difficult to detect or analyze.
*You had to admire the **subtlety** of the distinctions he drew.*
- uncertain** Not established or confirmed.
*I was **uncertain** how to proceed.*
- undifferentiated** Not differentiated.
*By six weeks the sexual glands are as yet **undifferentiated** between male and female.*
- vague** Not clearly expressed or understood.
*Their descriptions of human behavior become **vague** dull and unclear.*
- vaguely** In a way that is unfocused or lacks attention; absent-mindedly.
*He nodded **vaguely**.*
- wispy** Lacking clarity or distinctness.
*A few **wispy** memories of childhood.*
